Epistle Reading: 1 John 1:1—2:2



My little children, I am writing these things to you so that you may not sin. But if anyone does sin, we have an advocate with the Father, Jesus Christ the righteous. He is the propitiation for our sins, and not for ours only but also for the sins of the whole world.

If you forgive the sins of anyone, they are forgiven; if you withhold forgiveness from anyone, it is withheld."




"Have you believed because you have seen me? Blessed are those who have not seen and yet have believed."


