



Welcome to the sixth season of String Theory! With 18 phenomenal musicians, 15 of whom will be making their Chattanooga debut, season six promises to be the most dynamic season yet for String Theory.

We are thrilled to open the season with legendary pianist and Kennedy Center Honors Recipient, **Leon Fleisher**, in a program of piano solo/duos with his wife, internationally renowned pianist, **Katherine Jacobson**

Season Six will include our first ever percussion trio as well as a woodwind ensemble featuring some of the superstars of these instrumental combinations. Percussionists Ayano Kataoka, Ian Rosenbaum and **Christopher Froh** will bring an exhilarating program that will be both sonically and visually captivating.

Another first is that String Theory musicians will present concerts both in Chattanooga and in Cleveland. Flutist Tara O'Connor, bassoonist Peter Kolkay and oboist James Austin Smith will be with us for a 3-day-residency which will begin with Thursday evening's concert at the Hunter Museum, followed by a concert in Cleveland (at Lee University's beautiful Chapel), and conclude with our second annual Family Concert with a show specially designed for this occasion by our host, Rami Vamos.


We will continue our tradition of introducing the most distinguished string quartets to String Theory with a performance for our Holiday Concert by the Grammy-winning Pacifica Quartet. Anthony McGill, a String Theory favorite, returns for our Valentine's Day concert as he debuts as the Principal Clarinet at the New York Philharmonic.

Our season finale will highlight the Brahms' profound *Piano Quartet in A* major with the illuminating **Hsin-Yun Huang** (viola), **Paul Watkins** (cello) and **Soovin Kim** (violin).


