Our Season Nine opens with Mozart's delightful "Kegelstatt" trio for clarinet, viola and piano with legendary clarinetist **David Shifrin**, and violist **Paul Neubauer**, who will be making his *String Theory* debut. The program will also include clarinet trios of Bruch and Schumann as well as a gorgeous *Romance* for viola and piano by British composer, Benjamin Dale.




