DEAR FRIEND,



I certainly didn't expect to be in year two of a pandemic. In the beginning, we hoped we were on the way to recovery, but soon we realized that we were in it for the long haul. This didn't stop the Hope Partnership Team from holistically addressing the needs of our community. In fact, adapting to the pandemic made us a stronger organization as we began to navigate new avenues to empower our neighbors, strengthen our communities, and build hope. Your support made everything possible, and we can't thank you enough.

Our Hope Cares team is always on the front lines, making sure our neighbors have what they need on a daily basis. I'm incredibly proud

of the work this team did to house 22 of our neighbors who were without shelter for years. By all accounts, this program had an incredibly successful year.

This was also the inaugural year of Hope Works, a pathway to employment and stability for our neighbors experiencing homelessness and poverty. Thanks to the generous partnership of AdventHealth, we partnered with organizations such as Westgate Resorts, Walt Disney World Resort, and MasterCorp Hiring to provide employment solutions to some of our neighbors who face the greatest barriers.

As we navigated through the year, marked by impressive growth and change, we realized that our original building on Four Winds Blvd could no longer sustain our team and the scope of our work. In late December, we moved on from that property to explore new spaces that will allow us to serve our neighbors in even greater ways.

Looking ahead, we are excited to complete our new space: Hope Commons. It is located in downtown Kissimmee on the property of First United Methodist Church. This property will serve as the home base for Hope Works, IDignity Osceola, and we will also welcome some of our nonprofit partners into the space, including Habitat for Humanity, Justice for our Neighbors, and iBuild. I can't wait to see all that will be accomplished at Hope Commons.

We are moving forward, together, on what is set to be an incredible year for Hope Partnership. I am grateful to have you along with us on our journey. Together, we will make sure that everyone has a safe place to call home.






We're proud to say we've earned GuideStar's Highest Seal of Transparency.
