## Survivor Counseling Services:

Individual or group counseling for domestic violence or substance abuse. Serving survivors of all genders.

### **Lutheran Settlement House Bilingual Domestic Violence Program: 215-426-8610, ext. 1282**

Individual counseling for survivors of all genders, teens, and children who witness domestic violence. Group programming includes parenting after violence and economic justice.

### **Congreso de Latinos Unidos Latina Domestic Violence Program: 215-763-8870, ext. 1353**

Individual and group counseling for survivors of all genders, teens, and children who witness domestic violence.

### **Joseph J. Peters Institute: 215-665-8670 ext. 5105**

Counseling services for survivors of trauma. Accept private insurance.

## Counseling Services for Abusive Behavior Change:

### **Courdea: 215-242-2235**

Individual counseling for people who have been verbally or physically harmful in a relationship, or who are worried about how they treat their partner. Services available in English and Spanish. Accept private insurance and sliding scale fees available.

### **Joseph J. Peters Institute: 215-701-1560 ext. 5034**

JJPI's Safety and Responsibility Programs are for people who have sexual behavior problems or who have perpetrated relational violence. Accept private insurance.

## Resources for Survivors of Human Trafficking:

24-Hour hotline and connection to services for female-identified people exploited by the commercial sex industry in the Kensington neighborhood of Philadelphia, including a drop-in center.

### **Dawn's Place: Help Hotline: 1-888-3737-888, or 215-849-2396**

Residential services for female-identified people exploited by the commercial sex industry or sex trafficking. Services include case management, trauma-informed group and individual therapy, and connection to resources.

### **Covenant House: 215-951-5411**

Serving homeless, trafficked, or runaway youth (18-24 years old) through residential programs, outreach, and connection to resources.
