Marquis Studios Arts Education programs provide inclusive, engaging, and enriching arts learning experiences which incorporate Social Emotional Learning, Culturally Responsive Curriculum, Universal Design for Learning strategies as well as Arts Integration with Academic subject areas.

In partnership with NYC schools, we provide programming in various arts disciplines which:

- Engage and empower young creative artists of all abilities.
- Develop critical thinking skills and social emotional learning.
- Expand arts literacy through cultural and community connections, highlighting marginalized voices.

PROGRAM MENU 2022-2023

Programs are available for Pre-K through 12th grade, District 75, and Multilingual Learners and are always customized to students' appropriate age and/or skill level. All residencies integrate the arts with instruction in academic subjects according to the NYC Blueprint for Teaching and Learning in the Arts. Each residency is led by a professional Teaching Artist who partners with classroom teachers and after-school coordinators to support curriculum objectives and provide artistically enriching experiences to students.

PROGRAM STRUCTURE

Residencies are generally conducted one day a week over a tenweek period but can be extended upon request. Programming is provided on a cycle basis and observes all school closures:

> Cycle 1: October–December Cycle 2: January–March Cycle 3: April–June

Residencies and workshops may be conducted in-person or remotely.

In-school residencies: serve four to six classrooms during the school day.

After-school residencies: 90 minutes of instructional time during after-school hours. Programs can be broken into two consecutive 45-minute sessions.

Workshops: 90 minutes of instructional time during after-school hours or on Saturday mornings.

Professional Development Workshops: 90 minutes of training for school staff.

ABOUT OUR PROGRAMS



VISUAL ARTS

Visual arts at Marquis Studios encompasses a variety of 2D and 3D art forms. Students learn about color, line, texture, and composition through experimentation and visual literacy. Students explore the elements of art and draw inspiration from their imagination and the world ground them.



MUSIC

Students explore the creative process of music- making through collaboration. Our music programs introduce students to the complexity of rhythm, tempo, and reading musical notations through instruction in percussion, singing, and listening.



THEATER

Theater programs develop social-emotional skills, build critical thinking and literacy, and cultivate creative expression including, but not limited to, playwriting, acting, and directing. Students learn to use their imaginations, bodies, voices, emotions, and sense of artistry to tell unique stories that examine their individuality, their communities, and the world around them.



DANCE

Through dance, students build strength, self-awareness, self-management, and artistic expression. Dance develops focus, collaboration, and rhythmic expression. Students learn to use the power of dance to communicate ideas, while learning about a variety of cultures and building cross-cultural connections.



MEDIA ARTS/DIGITAL MEDIA

Media Arts programs develop students' creative voice through a digital artistic medium. Using their imaginations and observing their environment, students develop skills in visual storytelling. Students build connections to self, community, and other art forms using technology. Students also build skills and some technological proficiency in specific programs.

VISUAL ARTS

ABSTRACT ART

All Ages

Students express ideas and feeling through color, pattern, and spatial relationships rather than literal or figurative representations. Students may use a variety of mixed media like collage, drawing, painting, paper maché etc.

ARCHITECTURE

1st Grade & Up

Students discover the architectural process by using paper, cardboard, rulers, and pencils to draw floor plans to scale and construct models of buildings and bridges.

BOOKMAKING

1st Grade & Up

Students learn paper-folding techniques to create different types of books (accordion, popup, etc.) and then fill the books with text or images to make them come alive.

COLLAGE

All Ages

Students learn composition, overlapping, cutting, and adhering pieces. Students may examine photomontage, assemblage and create works of art using paper, glue, and found objects (string, cotton balls, stickers, buttons, etc.)

DRAWING

All Ages

Students learn the basics of drawing from observation and imagination using line, shape, value, form, color, and texture. Students use paper and markmaking materials (pencils, pen, crayons, markers, etc.) to broaden visual vocabulary.

ECO-ART

1st Grade & Up

Using the natural world as inspiration, students create projects reflecting on environmental themes. Students may be introduced to recycled materials and found objects as well as traditional art materials.

ISLAMIC ARTS & CULTURE

3rd Grade & Up

Inspired by Arabic patterns, calligraphy and other motifs, students create drawings that spark dialogue about Islamic arts and culture and connect what they learn with their own cultural heritage.

MASK MAKING

All Ages

The tradition of mask making is found throughout cultures around the world. Whether it is inspired by being a super hero or an animal like a zebra, students' imaginations soar when they design, develop, and wear their unique masks.



VISUAL ARTS

MOSAIC

All Ages

Students in this residency will learn how to arrange geometric paper shapes and/or pre-cut tiles into unique patterns and images. They may work individually or as a team.

MURAL

3rd Grade & Up

Developing a mural is a collaborative arts experience. Students will discuss, design, and create a portable mural on materials such as fabric, banner paper, or canvas for the school community.

PAINTING

All Ages

Students learn painting techniques using brushes and paint (watercolor, acrylic, tempera, etc.). Sessions will focus on the color wheel and color mixing, blending, and layering.

PAPER SCULPTURE

1st Grade & Up

Students learn to manipulate paper through folding, curling, bending, scoring, and quilling; transforming it to 3D sculptures.

THE PERSONAL POWER PROJECT

3rd Grade & Up

Students explore their personal identity, what sparks their interest, and what makes them unique. They use a variety of materials to create symbols of their personal power (emblems, banners, portraits, logos, etc.) to build and strengthen self- esteem.

PRINTMAKING

2nd Grade & Up

Students learn printmaking techniques to create original prints using a variety of traditional and nontraditional mediums such as: Styrofoam, rubber, monoprint, and stamping.

PUPPET MAKING

Kindergarten & Up

Students take a hands-on approach to the craft of puppetry, using an array of visual art materials to design and build their own creative puppets with unique character traits and expressions.

ORIGAMI

3rd Grade & Up

Students explore the ancient Japanese art of origami by transforming flat paper into 3D objects and animals.



VISUAL ARTS

SCIENCE THROUGH SCULPTURE & PAINTING

1st Grade & Up

Students learn about scientific concepts through artistic exploration. This residency is best paired with a science curriculum.

SELF PORTRAITS

1st Grade & Up

Students learn how to represent facial features using a variety of materials inspired by self-portraits by professional artists. They reflect on their own identity and how to portray themselves and their interests.

WORLD MARKETPLACE

3rd Grade & Up In-person only**

Students study art, culture, financial literacy, and social responsibility by participating as lenders to a Kiva entrepreneur. Teams of students also develop a business plan around craft items they create and sell at the school's culminating "Marketplace Fair," where each group of student entrepreneurs sells the items they have made to raise money for a local charity of their choosing.



MUSIC

AFRICAN DRUMMING

1st Grade & Up

Students explore the rich rhythms of Africa and the diaspora through the polyrhythmic percussive sounds of the drums. Students engage in the collaborative practice of drum circles to explore rhythms from different regions of Africa and the Caribbean.

CHORUS

Kindergarten & Up

Students learn the basics of rhythm, melody, harmony, and breathing through vocal warm ups and instruction on how to break down learning and memorizing songs.

GARAGEBAND® (MEDIA ARTS)

4th Grade & Up

Working in teams, students will compose and record a song while expanding their music technology vocabulary. GarageBand© is a fun and easy software program for budding musicians.

LATIN PERCUSSION

1st Grade & Up

Teaching Artists introduce students to traditional Latin American drums and percussion instruments and their Spanish names. Students learn how to play syncopated Latin rhythms.

MUSIC & RHYTHM

All Ages

Making music allows students to learn about tempo, melody, and pitch. This residency includes a mixture of chorus and percussion and can be adapted to the students' level of musical knowledge.

PERCUSSION OF THE WORLD

1st Grade & Up

This multi-cultural exploration focuses on drumming styles and percussion instruments from around the world. Schools are asked to select regions of the world when booking.

SAMBA DRUMMING

3rd Grade & Up

Samba has a rich heritage with musical roots in African, European, and Indigenous American culture. Students learn about Brazil, famous for its Samba music and play common Samba rhythms.

SONGWRITING

1st Grade & Up

Students express themselves through music and get acquainted with the basic components of song creation. Working as an ensemble, the class will choose words and phrases for a song around a theme that the students select.

MUSIC

TAIKO DRUMMING

2nd Grade & Up

Japanese Taiko drumming is a physically-charged and precise centuries old art form. Students learn how to play Taiko rhythms and related vocabulary while becoming immersed in Japanese culture.



THEATER

CIRCUS ARTS

All Ages

Students engage in physical theater and performance art circus techniques such as clowning, and comedy, in addition to learning skills such as juggling, balancing, and floor exercises.

DEVISED THEATER

All Ages

In this creative theater making experience, students develop a unique script while taking on the role of writer, actor, or director. Learning through collaborative play development, students empower their voices, stimulate their minds, and captivate their imaginations.

FOLKTALES & FAIRYTALES

All Ages

Students explore why people tell stories and how stories have been told throughout history by reading, exploring, and performing folktales and fairytales from various cultures.

GREEK MYTHOLOGY

5th Grade & Up

This residency allows students to learn about storytelling through the lens of ancient Greek myths. Students explore history and how these characters appear in legends across cultures and time periods.



THEATER

IMPROVISATION

3rd Grade & Up

Through improv activities, students learn to trust their creative impulses and collaborate with peers as they build characters and scenes. Students engage in narrative story development and sharpen both verbal and nonverbal communication skills.

MASK THEATER

2nd Grade & Up

The tradition of using masks in performance is found throughout many cultures around the world. Students learn about the cultural history of masks, while creating and performing a group theater piece focusing on characterization and movement.

MIME

1st Grade & Up

Students learn to observe and duplicate simple body and facial movements as well as human interactions to nonverbally tell a story that communicates a character's feelings and actions.

NEWSPAPER THEATER

4th Grade & Up

Current events and media content inspire students to create plays from social and political perspectives. Students write and perform original pieces to raise their audience's awareness about a particular event.

POETRY SLAM

5th Grade & Up

Students begin with the study of poetry and read examples that inspire them to write their own. But it doesn't stop there—students learn how to perform their own words with passion and power.

PROJECT RESPECT

1st Grade & Up

Students practice physical and verbal communication skills through performance in order to learn how to convey respect and support for peers. Through stories and examples, students are encouraged to reflect on and celebrate diversity.

PUPPET THEATER

Kindergarten & Up

Students learn about puppeteering as they bring puppets to life through vocal projection, character, and puppet movement. With a focus on storytelling, students are able to embody characters and different perspectives via their puppets.

STORYTELLING

1st Grade & Up

Students write and perform their own original stories as they explore the parts of a story (setting, plot, character, etc.) and are inspired by stories they are reading in other classes.



DANCE

AFRICAN DANCE

2nd Grade & Up

Students learn a variety of traditional and contemporary dances from different regions of the continent as well as styles from the African Diaspora.

"BE WELL" MOVEMENT

All Ages

Students explore biology and anatomy through dance, learning about the muscular and skeletal systems and how they allow our bodies to move.

BHANGRA FOLK DANCE

All Ages

Bhangra is a popular traditional dance in India, often featured at celebrations and weddings. Students learn the history and traditions of India as well as movements from Bhangra folk dance.

BOLLYWOOD DANCE

All Ages

In synchronized harmony, Bollywood's fast, lively and rhythmic dance form incorporates a fusion of classical and Indian folk dances as well as hip hop and contemporary dance styles.

BROADWAY DANCE

3rd Grade & Up

Students learn the steps to favorite Broadway musical numbers while exploring musical theater history and nuances. Focus is specifically on the dances of Broadway, rather than singing and acting.

CREATIVE MOVEMENT

Pre-K to 3rd Grade

This residency serves as an introduction to dance, in which students will improve spatial awareness, develop gross and fine motor skills, and hone rhythm and body control by following their natural creative physical impulses.

DANCES FROM AROUND THE WORLD

2nd Grade & Up

In this unique residency, students "travel" to different countries around the world experiencing different cultures through their traditional dances. Schools are asked to select regions of the world when booking.

HIP HOP DANCE

2nd Grade & Up

Hip Hop culture is multifaceted and got its start here in NYC. Students learn breaking, popping and locking moves to popular music and are encouraged to create their own freestyle moves.



DANCE

LATIN DANCE

3rd Grade & Up

Students dance to the beat of Latin rhythms from Central and South America and the Caribbean, learning dances such as salsa, merengue, bachata, and cha-cha-cha.

STORYTELLING THROUGH MOVEMENT


3rd Grade & Up

Students explore how to tell a story and convey a message or emotion using only bodily movement, not words. This residency scaffolds well from Creative Movement.

YOGA

All Ages

Teaching Artists lead students through self-reflective exercises and ability-appropriate yoga poses. Students learn breath control, balance, and muscular coordination.



MEDIA ARTS

ANIMATION*

3rd Grade & Up

Students use laptops/tablets and drawing materials to explore animation techniques through storytelling and design principles to give life and movement to their art.

DIGITAL ARCHITECTURE **

3rd Grade & Up

Students design, sketch and create buildings on a computer.
The final product is a 3D structure that exists on the computer.

FILMMAKING*

3rd Grade & Up

Students learn storyboarding skills and use laptops/tablets/phones to practice basic filmmaking techniques.

PHOTOGRAPHY

3rd Grade & Up

Students use a tablet/phone/camera to take photos while studying points of view, composition, and how photography can be used as a powerful means of communication.

GENERAL REQUIREMENTS:

Animation, Photography, and Filmmaking residencies include 10 sessions with students plus an additional 2 sessions for the teaching artist to professionally edit the video.

*HARDWARE AND SOFTWARE REQUIREMENTS:

- 3-4 digital cameras, iPads, HD recorders OR flip cameras to record footage.
- Computer lab or laptop cart with iMovie software installed (free with Mac computers).
- An in-house IT support person on staff to assist the teaching artist with software installation and basic troubleshooting.

**DIGITAL ARCHITECTURE HARDWARE AND SOFTWARE REQUIREMENTS:

- Minimum of 1 PC or Mac computer for every 2 students.
- SketchUp or ArchiCAD17 on each computer (free downloads).
- An in-house IT support person on staff to assist the teaching artist with software installation and basic troubleshooting.



WORKSHOPS

Workshops are offered as single sessions rather than multi-week residencies. Students are encouraged to collaborate with their parents, siblings, peers, or caregivers in the art-making process. Workshop participants can be students and families, students and school administrators, or for parents and guardians only. Workshops may be conducted remotely or in-person.

OPTIONS:

One 90-minute workshop with art activity for up to 25 student and guardian pairs led by a Marquis Studios Teaching Artist.

OR

Two consecutive 45-minute workshops with art activity for up to 25 student and guardian pairs each, led by a Marquis Studios Teaching Artist.
