



from death . . . . . to life

Jesus said, "TRULY, TRULY, I SAY TO YOU, WHOEVER HEARS MY WORD AND BELIEVES HIM WHO SENT ME HAS ETERNAL LIFE. HE DOES NOT COME INTO JUDGMENT BUT HAS PASSED FROM DEATH TO LIFE." (John 5:24)

Paul wrote, "Wretched man that I am! Who will deliver me from this body of Death? Thanks be to god through Jesus Christ our Lord!" (Romans 7:24-25)

Consider then these verses:

OH GOD, I UNDERSTAND
THAT I AM A GUILTY SINNER
AND DESERVE YOUR JUDGMEUT.
THANK YOU THAT JESUS CHRIST
DIED ON THE CROSS FOR MY
SINS—RUD ROSE AGAIN FOR
ME. I ASK YOU TO CLEANSE
ME FROM ALL MY SIN. PLEASE
CHANGE ME! I GIVE YOU ALL
CHANGE ME! I GIVE YOU ALL
OF MY LIFE. IN THE NAME OF
JESUS, AMEN."



The words "It is finished" are applied to us when we ask Jesus for forgiveness. The following prayer expresses what is involved in receiving Christ's forgiveness:

" IF WE SAY WE HAVE NO SIN, WE DECEIVE OUR-SELVES, AND THE TRUTH IS NOT IN US. IF WE CONFESS OUR SINS, HE IS FAITHFUL AND JUST TO FORGIVE US OUR SINS AND TO CLEANSE US FROM ALL UNRIGHTEOUSNESS." (1 John 1:8-9)



(2) Knowing who to ask—the One who said "It is finished!"

(1) Recognizing that we are guilty and in need of forgiveness.



Faith or belief implies that we ask for forgiveness. Asking for forgiveness involves two things:

"THEREFORE, SINCE WE HAVE BEEN JUSTIFIED BY FAITH, WE HAVE PEACE WITH GOD THROUGH OUR LORD JESUS CHRIST." (Romans 5:1)

Jesus died for us, so that we could be freed from our sin-guilt. Then, rather than condemning us, God chose to justify us through Christ's death. Our part is to believe in Him—to trust in what Jesus did for us.

" FOR ONE WILL SCARCELY DIE FOR A RIGHTEOUS PERSON—THOUGH PERHAPS FOR A GOOD PERSON ONE WOULD DARE EVEN TO DIE— BUT GOD SHOWS SINUEEN, CHRIST DIED FOR US. SINCE, THEREFORE, WE HAVE NOW BEEN JUSTIFIED BY HIS BLOOD, MUCH MORE SHALL WE BE SAVED BY HIM FROM THE WUCH MORE SHALL WE BE SAVED BY HIM FROM THE WORTH OF GOD." (Romans 5:7-9)

As Jesus bore our sins, God showed us His immense love for us. And it is by His death that we are made righteous in God's sight.
