









Template Sustainability Policy

A sustainability policy is a set of guidelines for your organisation around relevant environmental issues, such as energy use, travel, and waste. They can be useful for helping you to commit to environmental actions and making sure that your whole team is on board and working to the same standards. These commitments are what will help increase climate action and create a bigger response to the climate crisis – they are important.

This document is a template and contains only suggestions. Add more, makes changes, whatever works for you and your organisation. It should be used in conjunction with our sustainability audit to help you identify areas to work on for your organisation. Use the sustainability audit spreadsheet to assess what you already do in your organisation and to help you think about what you might be able to achieve in the future.

You do not have to put every item in your sustainability policy. The audit can help you decide what is realistically achievable for your organisation. While we would encourage you to do as much as possible to improve your sustainability, if you put it in your policy you need to be able to commit to doing it. If something is not currently possible, you can describe in your policy how you will work towards achieving it in the future (with a practical timescale). Remember to think about how this policy links with others you might have. We cannot think about climate action in isolation – everything impacts something else!

Travel

- Having all taps checked for leaks and drips regularly and putting up reminder signs at taps to switch off
- Having a water metre fitted for our building

Finance

We would like to contribute towards green and ethical investments by:

- Reviewing our bank's environmental and investment practices to see how our money is being used
- Ensuring our pension provider has an Ethical, Social and Governance fund option for staff











Waste

In order to reduce the impact on the environment from waste, we aim to reduce our waste to a minimum by:

- Using recycled paper in our offices
- Completing a waste audit and identifying areas where we can reduce waste. In addition, we aim to reduce food waste in our organisation by:
- Ordering 10-20% less food for events

Improving the local environment and increasing biodiversity

We would like to contribute to making our area cleaner and to help increase wildlife by:

- Completing a local litter pick twice a year
- Using our outside space to plant a wildflower meadow
