

MARIN COUNTY EVACUATION RISK ASSESSMENT MEETING STATE MANDATES

PURPOSE

Why?

The California Legislature, in response to major wildfires in California beginning in 2017, passed the following bills related to wildfire evacuation that is a mandate for local agencies to fulfill. The work conducted by MWPA helps all Marin agencies meet these mandates.

METHODOLOGY

What was the process?

The Study produced countywide maps to support partner agencies in meeting the above legislative requirement.

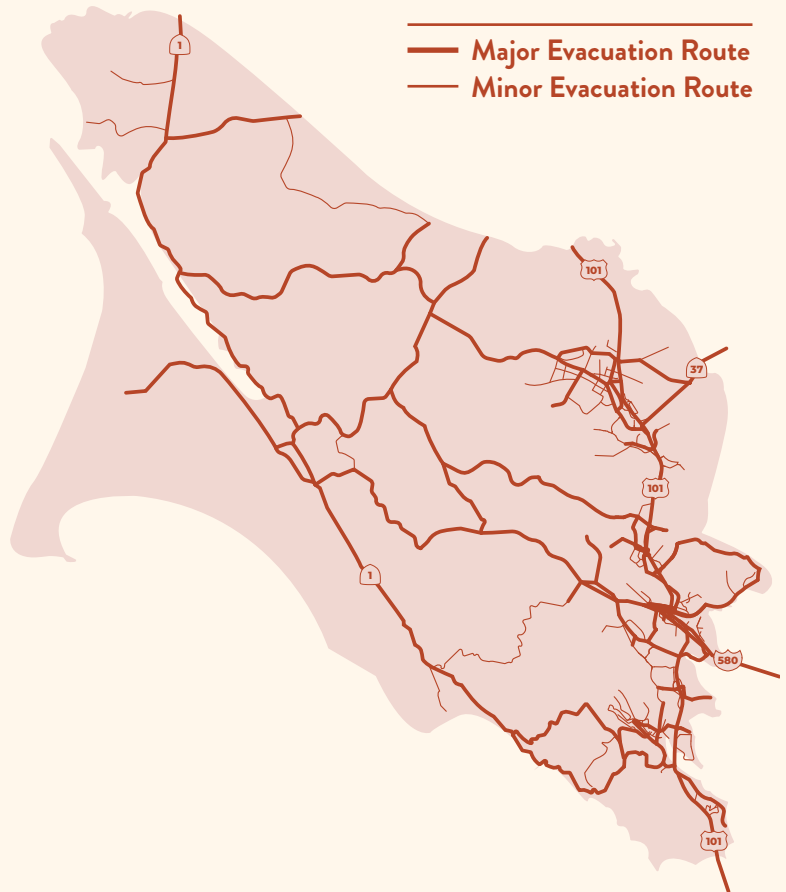
- » **SB 99** – Streets that serve as the single egress for a minimum of 30 residential parcels are coded to reflect the adopted CAL FIRE designations for the area in which the streets are located.
- » **AB 747 Evacuation Routes** – Major evacuation routes include highways and arterial streets. Minor evacuation routes include major collector streets.

NEAR-TERM BENEFITS

What will be done to help now?

MWPA and partner agencies are using the maps generated by the Study to generate near-term community benefits as follows.

- » SB 99 constrained residential streets map was used to prioritize residential streets for implementation of parking management, street and canopy fuel reduction measures, and other strategies.
- » AB 747 evacuation routes map was used as a factor in roadway risk reduction rating, to support local agency plan updates, prioritize traffic management locations, prioritize capital projects to improve evacuation traffic flow, and support grant applications.



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
