Market minute



Equities

U.S. equities capped off an unexpected banner year by rising for a 9th straight week, a feat last accomplished in 2004. The S&P 500 gained 24.23% in 2023, ending the year within basis points of its all-time high. Returns were incredibly lopsided last year – the tech and communication services sectors each rose more than 50% while consumer staples, energy, and utilities each declined. The Magnificent 7, representing more than a quarter of the S&P 500, more than doubled as a group and drove nearly two-thirds of the index return. International stocks lagged but still finished up. U.S. stocks enter 2024 priced at 20x expected earnings.

Fixed income

The 10-year Treasury ends 2023 at 3.88%, close to where it started, traveling in a range of 3.31%-5.00%. The Fed raised rates to 5.25-5.50%, the highest since 2001. Economic expectations drove long-term yields and fixed income performance. In Q1, recession fears and the March regional bank failures caused a modest core fixed income rally, only to suffer a sharp sell-off on the back of economic optimism in late summer/fall. The Fed's dovish pivot in Q4 left markets pricing in six rate cuts for this year and carried a swing back to positive territory for bond performance. One note of caution: the yield curve ends the year still deeply inverted.

Commodities

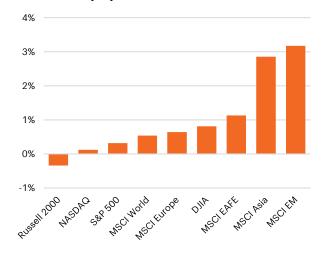
Oil moved lower during 2023, ending at \$71.65/bbl. The primary stories of the year involved disappointing demand outside the U.S. – and especially in China – as well as surging oil production in the U.S., where supply ended the year at an all-time high of 13.3mmbpd. Appetite among non-Saudi OPEC members to further support prices appears lukewarm. Gold ended near an all-time high as real rates plunged in Q4.

Economic overview

Pervasive fear of recession at the start of 2023 proved unwarranted as the economy fired on all cylinders last year. The primary engine remained the consumer, supported by the labor market and still carried on the tailwind of excess pandemic savings. Business investment, led by a recovery in bricks and mortar building, was also robust, and government spending added to what is likely to be growth of about 3.0% Q4/Q4 for the year. Inflation decelerated from 6.4% at the start of the year to 3.1% y/y in November, although the decline has been uneven and core CPI remains 4.0% y/y.

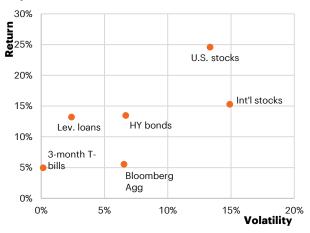

S&P 500: Leading single benchmark of large-cap U.S. equities, representing approximately 500 of the largest U.S. companies. Dow Jones Industrial Average: Price-weighted measure of 30 U.S. blue-chip companies. NASDAQ: Stock market index of stocks listed on the NASDAQ. Index is heavily weighted toward technology companies. Russell 2000: Index measuring performance of approximately 2,000 small-cap U.S. equities. MSCI World Index: Broad global equity benchmark including both developed and emerging markets. MSCI Europe Index: Equity benchmark that measures the performance of large and mid-cap equities across 15 developed countries in Europe. Interest rates

Fed funds target: Target rate for the federal funds policy rate, set by the Federal Reserve each meeting. SOFR: Secured Overnight Financing Rate (SOFR) measures the cost of borrowing cash overnight collateralized by Treasuries. ICE 3-Month London Interbank Offered Rate (LIBOR): Average interest rate at which leading banks borrow funds of a sizable amount from other banks in the London market. LIBOR is the most widely used "benchmark" or reference rate for short-term interest rates. Treasury rates: Market yields for U.S. Treasury securities with maturities of 2, 10 and 30 years. Bloomberg Barclays U.S. Aggregate Bond Index: Broad-based flagship benchmark that measures the investment grade, U.S. dollar-denominated, fixed-rate taxable bond market. Bloomberg Barclays U.S. Corporate Index: Measures the USD-denominated, investment grade, fixed-rate, taxable bond market. Bloomberg Barclays U.S. Corporate High Yield Index: Measures the USD-denominated, high yield, fixed-rate bond market.
