Read 1 Corinthians 14

- 2. What does it mean to build another believer up? What does that look like in practice? Who has been someone that has provided this for you?
- 3. What is the purpose of the gift of prophesy according to **verse**3? How have you experienced those things at Spring Lake?
- 4. What role does edification play in this chapter? How is it seen to be vital in the life of the church?
- 5. How does this chapter speak against an individualistic mindset when it comes to our worship gatherings? How do **verses 16-19** apply to this?

- 7. Why should the church be aware of her conduct according to **verses 22-25**? Why should the church not assume that everyone that attends services is a follower of Jesus?
- 8. Based on what we read here (such as **verses 26-33**), how would you respond to someone who thinks that having order to services is limiting to the Holy Spirit?
- 9. **Verses such as 34-35** can be difficult to understand. What do you think we should do when the Bible makes controversial statements?
- 10. What do you do to try to build up other believers?
