

THE ROAD TO EMMAUS

March 30 & 31, 2024



READ Luke 24:13-35.

1. Have you ever doubted your beliefs? Talk about a time when you weren't sure about your faith. How does the story of the disciples feeling unsure but then believing again relate to your own life?
2. The disciples thought Jesus was going to be a leader who would change their world in a big way, but He had a different plan. Have you ever expected one thing from God but got something completely different? Share what happened and how you felt.
3. The trip to Emmaus in the story represents moving from feeling sad and hopeless to feeling hopeful. What does Emmaus mean to you in your own journey of faith? Why do you think the journey itself is important?
4. Jesus explained to the disciples how the stories from the Old Testament were about Him. How does reading the Old Testament help us understand Jesus better? Can you share a story from the Old Testament that helped you see Jesus in a new light?
5. The disciples realized who Jesus was when they were together and reading the Scriptures. Why are being with other believers and reading the Bible important in recognizing Jesus in our lives? How have these helped you feel closer to Jesus?
6. Jesus talked about Moses and the prophets and how they pointed to Him. Why is it important to know what the prophets said about Jesus? Is there a prophecy that made you understand Jesus more?
7. The disciples felt their hearts warm when Jesus explained the Scriptures to them. Have you ever read something in the Bible that touched you deeply or felt very personal? What was it and how did it make you feel?
8. When Jesus broke bread, the disciples finally recognized Him. How does taking Communion (the Lord's Supper) help you remember and understand what Jesus did for us? What does this act mean to you?
9. After seeing Jesus alive, the disciples couldn't wait to tell others. How does knowing Jesus is alive change the way you live or share your faith with others?
10. If Jesus asked you what you're focused on or worried about in life, what would you say? How does thinking about this question help you see what's really important in your faith?
