family **DEVOTION**

SUMMARY: MARK 1:1-13

Mark doesn't record the story of Jesus's birth or Jesus's genealogy like other Gospel writers do; he launches right into the action by introducing John the Baptist. John was sent to announce Jesus's coming and to prepare the way for the long-awaited Messiah. He did this by baptizing people in the Jordan river as a sign of repentance and forgiveness of sin. This section finishes with Jesus's own baptism by John and the miraculous way that God appeared to confirm that Jesus is His Son.

discussion QUESTIONS

Why do you think John lived in such a strange way? What did this teach people about Jesus and His mission?

Why were people going to John to be baptized? Why do we get baptized today as followers of Jesus?

PRAY: Thank God that He left no room for doubt that Jesus is His Son. Thank Him for leaving us the Gospels—eyewitness accounts of Jesus's life, death, and resurrection. Pray that He would teach you more about Himself through your study of the book of Mark.

SUMMARY: MARK 1:35-45

Jesus knew the importance of rest, and He took time away to spend with His Father in prayer. But His disciples and the crowds were so curious about Him that it was hard to get away from them. Mark spends a lot of time in his Gospel focusing on Jesus's miracles and healings. In this passage Jesus cleanses a man with a skin disease. He instructs the man not to tell anyone, but the man can't help himself—he starts to tell anyone who will listen about this man who made him clean.

discussion questions

Why do you think the man who Jesus healed was so excited that he couldn't help but talk about Jesus?

When has Jesus done something in your life that you couldn't help but share with others? What made it so wonderful?

PRAY: Thank Jesus for the incredible compassion He showed the man in today's session, and thank Him for the incredible compassion He continues to show the world today. Ask God to give you eyes to view the people around you with His love and compassion.

Summary: MARK 3:20-35

Jesus's family heard about the kind of crowds He was gathering, and they were worried about His behavior. The scribes were worried too, and they started to accuse Jesus of working with Satan to perform His miracles. Jesus used the opportunity to teach several lessons to the scribes and the rest of the crowd that was gathered. It didn't make sense that He would be working with Satan, since Satan is focused on destruction, and Jesus's mission involved healing, forgiveness, and salvation. He also taught that His family goes far beyond biological connections: anyone who does the will of God is part of Jesus's spiritual family.

discussion QUESTIONS

• **01** Why did Jesus speak so sternly to the scribes who accused Him of working with Satan?

When you think of people in your community who do the will of God, who comes to mind? Why?

PRAY: Praise God for sending His Son to us so we could learn what it means to be part of the family of God.

Jesus demonstrated that when we follow Him, He can and will provide for our needs.

.02 How has Jesus provided for you in amazing ways?

PRAY: Praise God for knowing all of our needs before we do. Thank Him for sending His Son to meet our need for forgiveness. Ask Him to show you how you can serve others in your community this week.
