
Da'BEST

Dagat village is located near to the largest RAMSAR sites in Malaysia and Tabin Forest Reserve.






- Dagat is home to the indigenous tidung people.
- we have been living in this area since 1980s.
- The main economic activity is fishing, we don't have palm oil.



- Homestay in Dagat has established officially in 2006.
- In fact, eco-tourism is a supportive income stream for indigenous ethnic in Dagat.
- The market for ecotourism was mostly from Japan.

• Eco-tourism activity in Dagat conserved the natural environment and preserved the indigenous cultural heritage.




Tanduo Village incident, Lahad Datu in 2013 has led to a sharp fall in the rate of tourist arrival especially those who came from Japan.

- Some of the young generation had to come back to their village to help and looked for a way on how to start up a plan.




- On March 2015, Dagat representatives began to participate in a series of workshops with other villages in the RAMSAR site.
- The event was held at the Kulamba Field Centre.



- The process involved discussion and find ways forward to address a wide range of issues.
- Thus, community mapping training was held on December 2015 which was also the first step for us to build capacity.



 The mapping data consist of village locality, village land, tourism sites, areas of cultural and historical value, NTFP, fishing areas, encroached fishing areas, potential tagal sites, traditional boundaries and traditional fishing boundaries.



 Through community mapping, we will be able to map out our local natural resources more effectively.





• Community mapping also enables us to plan, manage and decide tourist attraction sites more effectively.



In order to have a better management plan, the committee members of Dagat Village Homestay have attended and discussed the strategic planning of eco-tourism in Dagat on June 2016.



This was done through a workshop organized by Community-Based Ecologically Sustainable Tourism (C'BEST) from Forever Sabah, Koperasi Pelancongan Mukim Batu Puteh (KOPEL), and Land Empowerment Animals People (LEAP) with a joint effort from the homestay owner.




The outcome from the workshop is a strategic planning of eco-tourism in Dagat.


 On top of that, we want to prove to everyone that we can utilize our land and natural resources in a sustainable way and take this opportunity to be part of the nature guardians.
