Thank you to Mrs Chapman and Mrs Druery for organising the day's programme, and thanks to the Friends of Springbank for their financial support of the day.


During the 2nd week of school, Mrs. Chapman and Mrs. Druery hosted an amazing Leadership day for the Year 12s and 13s.
