Agri Pet / Art Day

We held our annual Agri Pet / Art Day on Wednesday 26th October. The Agri Pet Competition was started back in 2015 by one of our senior students, Kimberley Knight. The event was a huge success and thoroughly enjoyed by both participants and spectators, that it has continued and grown, now in it's 8th year. The Agri Art Competition was introduced two years later in 2017, with the art entries including a colouring competition, vegetable sculpture, cupcake decoration, flower displays to Gingerbread men, varying each year.

Once again the Agri Pet / Art Day was a wonderful success with our biggest entry of animals to date. I think we said this last year, but with a total of 14 lambs and calves, and one goat, the 2022 event is the biggest!

It was fantastic to see four children from Preschool enter with their lambs and calves this year. Most of their animals were bigger than them, but they demonstrated amazing confidence and determination whilst leading their animal around the arena. The event consisted of three categories this year; Best Lead, Grooming and Costume. Certificates are awarded for the top three placings, along with, Best in Show Lamb & Calf, and Overall Grand Winner.

It was a wonderful morning with the 14 Agri Pet participants showcasing their beautifully groomed animals and fabulous costume choices. This year we had Christmas dress-ups, a gardener, mermaid, bumble bee, Little Bo Beep, and spider lamb to name just a few. A big thanks to our judge Alister Megaw who had the difficult task of judging, and thanks also to Amelia Morris (Year 10) who set up the arena, and supported the participants throughout the event.

The Agri Art Competition is held in the gym and this year the students were encouraged to enter the colouring section, vegetable sculpture and flower plate. Mrs Hulse was our judge, and had the tricky job of picking out the top three placings and two highly commended certificates. The art section is an extremely hard competition to judge, as the creative flare, use of colour, and wide range of ideas make for a very competitive event.

And finally thank you to all the students who take part in our Agri Pet / Art Day. Your involvement and enthusiasm is fantastic, and that's what makes this event so much fun each year.

On Day Six, we did a campfire at Urupukapuka Island, making smores, singing songs, and roasting sausages.

One of the main highlights of the trip was definitely seeing the dolphins swimming in the water while snorkeling.

Our homestay families are paid (non-taxable) to host per day for the room and care that they provide and are subject to NZ police checks.


