Topics this year covered mould growth, water quality, biotoxins, music creation, to the effect of sugar on our teeth and much more.

The Science Fair gives students the opportunity to learn skills of research, how to think analytically, test theories, and examine results.






Bluefix Boatworks

A group of eight students headed over to Opua to visit the Bluefix Boatworks yard to watch one of their new boats, the NorthCape 43, being turned. While the boat was being guided very carefully out of the shed, Charlotte Rowe (co-owner of Bluefix) showed the students around the yard. The students learnt about the various components to building a boat, including design, ordering parts, engine requirements, sanding and painting, and building the boat itself. Once the boat was in position outsidem it was time to watch the crane driver use his skills to slowly turn the 3500-ton foam core composite hull to its upright position. The students were really impressed with the precision of the crane driver, and the huge amount of equipment required to make each boat comfortable and fast for their owners.





NZ Black Sticks Meet and Greet

On Tuesday 8th August, members of the Kiwi Sticks team (Year 5 & 6) and two players from the intermediate team (Year 7 & 8) had the opportunity to meet and have a few hits around the Kaikohe hockey turf with members from the Vantage Black Sticks teams. Malachi Buschl (Midfielder) and George Enersen (Goalie) from the men's team, and Stephanie Dickins (Defender), Alia Jaques (Forward), and Hope Ralph (Forward) from the women's team spent an hour with students from various local Far North schools, running through some basic hockey skills, before having a quick game of hockey.

It was a wonderful opportunity for our students to meet professional hockey players, ask them some questions, and grab some autographs. Eddie Warren, Year 6 asked a great question to the players: "How much do you train each week?" They told the students they train up to three times a week, go to the gym three times and play one game a week – just a little bit more training than our teams!

The three women Black Sticks players have an impressive 134 caps between them, and it was amazing to watch Alia and Hope dart around the turf so easily amongst the intermediate and collegiate players. After meeting the players and attending the international matches played down in Whangarei, several of our students are quite keen on becoming a Black Stick themselves, so watch this space!







Lions International Young Ambassador Competition

In mid-August, the 2023 Lions International Young Ambassador Zone 1 competition was held. The ambassador program is looking for leaders of the future, with an emphasis on community service.

Jaluka Clarke, Katija Zivkovich, and Youssef Awad attended the event, which requires them to complete three stages: submitting an application, being interviewed by a panel of three judges, and giving a speech about what they are passionate about.

Jaluka, Katija, and Youssef spoke at assembly on the Monday after the competition, and all agreed it was an amazing opportunity to be part of, and highly recommended their fellow students to step out of their comfort zone and give competitions like this a go.

Special congratulations goes to Youssef who won 3rd place on the evening.



Whangarei Rotary Speech Contest

We would like also congratulate Raffy McAngus (Prefect) who took part in the Whangarei Rotary Speech Contest on 19th August, winning Runner Up and \$500 prize money.

The aim of the contest is to inspire and encourage confidence in public speaking in schools. This is a prestigious event which has been running for 61 years. Raffy had to deliver a topical speech of at least 7 minutes in length. His speech was on *The Distractive Illusion of "Greatness"*, all about human ambition for historic fame and achievement rather than focusing on appreciating and looking after the present.

Raffy was then required to give an impromptu speech on an unknown topic that was given to them on the night. This year's topic was about 'the banning of mobile phone use on school grounds.'

This is a tough and very formal competition and Raffy presented exceptionally well, against mostly Year 13 students, resulting in his well-deserved Runner Up placing.



The Bay of Islands Beast

Two vans of students from Year 7 to 13, parents, and staff (Taryn Lynn and Jo Warren) made their way over to Puketona Road on Friday 25th August to take part in The Bay of Islands Beast run.

The course covers 7km of hills, mud, uneven terrain, mud, waterways, and mud! The course is designed to be tough, but lots of fun. Approximately 600 competitors took part in the school event on the Friday, and although on their return many students said it was freezing, they all agreed they had heaps of fun and would go back again next year.

Thanks to Hunter Blakeman and Oliver Sizer for organising the event and helping cook up some hot sausages for everyone at the end.









Education Perfect English Competition

Our Middle School competed in the Education Perfect English Competition. This is the first time we have participated in this competition, and we are thrilled with the results.

- 1st in New Zealand out of 68 schools in our category of 101-250 students.
- 8th overall in New Zealand out of 450 schools
- 18th overall globally out of 1,761 schools

Our students also received 2x Gold (top 2%), 6x Silver (top 5%), 19x Bronze (top 10%) and 3x Credit placings out of nearly 13,500 participants. What an outstanding effort; we are so proud of all the students who participated.




Education Perfect Science Competition

Our Year 7 - 10 students have also taken part in the Education Perfect Science Competition. Students were required to answer a series of questions based on their scientific knowledge. We are delighted to share that our Springbank School students have excelled again:

- 1st in New Zealand out of 67 schools in our category of 101-250 students.
- 4th overall in New Zealand out of 374 schools
- 13th overall globally out of 1,395 schools

Our students also received 4x Emerald (top 1.5%), 4x Gold (top 2%), 5x Silver (top 5%), 18x Bronze (top 10%) and 25x Credit placings. Another superb effort by all our students.



Basketball

The Springbank School Senior Basketball team of Oliver Sizer, Ruben Kistemaker, Hunter Blakeman, Oscar Murray and Youssef Awad have been having an excellent season on the court every Tuesday night at Waipapa. They have been winning every week except one game so far, against other teams from Whangaroa, Okaihau, and Kerikeri High. Congratulations and well done on a superb season.

We are excited to mention the exciting opportunity coming up for three of the team's players; Hunter Blakeman, Ruben Kistemaker, and Oscar Murray, who will be heading to the USA soon to play for the Mid North United Sports Association as part of the Under 17s Boys team.

First stop for the team, San Francisco for a week, where they will compete in their first tournament "King of the Town". Next, they will travel to Los Angeles where they compete in two different tournaments, "Fall Kick Out" and "The Launch".

After 12 days in Los Angeles the team will travel to Hawaii for the last 10 days, competing against local schools. Throughout the trip in between training and games, the boys will be able to explore the areas, famous landmarks, have some fun at Disneyland and of course, do some shopping.

The different tournaments are a chance for the team to test their skills and level of game at an international level, with each tournament having some of the best teams from the area competing.

We asked the boys "What are they looking forward to about the tournament / trip?"

- Hunter: "I am looking forward to playing in a country where the basketball culture is huge, and where we can compete at an international level."
- Ruben: "I am looking forward to spending the time overseas with my team and growing and exceeding my basketball skill and level."
- Oscar: "I'm looking forward to playing against diverse teams which will further my skills on the court, and obviously getting to experience California and Hawaii."

This is an amazing opportunity for Hunter, Ruben, and Oscar, and we wish them all the very best for the trip and look forward to hearing all about it when they get back.


Student Volunteer Army (SVA)
