Our 2023 Cambridge International examination results are in, and we have some excellent results to celebrate! Our teachers and students worked hard to achieve some great results and we are so proud of their successes. With its academic rigour, global standardisation, and development of key character strengths, the Cambridge International Curriculum prepares our students to achieve their best in tertiary study and the workforce. It is with pleasure that we reintroduce Gabriel Segerfröjd, our new staff member in the Middle and Senior School. Gabriel is a science and mathematics teacher, with a specialisation in physics. Gabriel has a Masters and a PhD in Aeronautical Engineering, he is a very experienced teacher, and he has previously taught Cambridge International Science and Physics, which is a bonus for us. We believe Gabriel will be a real asset to Springbank, and we look forward to you meeting him this term.

Greetings Springbank Community,

Over the years, I have heard such wonderful things about you, your school and most importantly, your students — keen to learn, well behaved, and with a positive attitude! This is, in fact, Springbank's values, not on paper but lived out daily - well done! I surely look forward to joining you in Term 1, 2024.

My wife and I relocated to New Zealand some sixteen years ago together with our three secondary-aged children, and that was my first experience with the NZ school system and NCEA, as I assisted them with their learning in a new country and with polishing their skills in our second language. With an engineering background (mechanical and civil), TeachNZ guided me to become a Physics and Mathematics teacher, and after training at Bethlehem Tertiary Institute in Tauranga, I taught in Auckland for a few years. It was at Auckland Grammar that I was introduced to Cambridge International, which I really enjoyed together with my students. It provides a quality check on the learning that has taken place over the years, without any bias.

We moved up North in 2015, and I have taught Engineering, Mathematics, Physics, and Science from Whangarei to Kaitaia during our time here. We live just south of Opua on a bush block that we tried to convert to some grazing (a lot of work for just a few 1000 sqms) as we have horses. We brought two Haflinger mares when we moved from Sweden, which now have become 10+ individuals, so a couple of years ago we needed much more grazing and purchased a farmlet further up north, meaning that I can travel to work within an hour irrespective of where we stay! The farmlet is where we enjoy animals, hay making and country life, and Russell, Opua and Paihia have got a nice tourist vibe that is enjoyable from time to time.

Again, thank you for inviting me to become part of your beautiful school.


They have created a delicious starter menu for our students and staff to enjoy (which our teachers have already had the pleasure of sampling!).

Initially, the café will operate as cash only, but they do plan on introducing an EFTPOS facility.

## Springbank School Fitness Track

The Springbank School fitness track is an excellent resource for our students to use every day as part of their morning fitness. But it is also a great resource for our families as well.

Our fitness track comprises several different loops, enabling the walker or runner to wind themselves around beautiful established native bush (first planted by Bob Warren back in 2015).

Parents and Caregivers are welcome to use the track, but please ensure you sign in at the office before you set off and also when you return back from the track. The surrounding paddocks are a working farm, so from time to time there will be stock and machinery moving about. We ask that any gates are left as you find them, be aware of the electric fencing, and dogs must be on a lead at all times.





## Springbank School Clothing

Springbank School has a range of branded clothing items for families to purchase. These clothing items are not a uniform, and they are not compulsory. However, they can be added in nicely to your child's everyday school wardrobe if you wish.

The easiest way to notify us, is by using the Edge App (please see instructions on how to upload this app on the next page). If you have any trouble, pop into the office and Taryn Lynn can help you set it up. Another way of notifying us is by emailing the school office first thing in the morning to let Taryn know so she can update the attendance records for teachers.

**Weekly Assemblies:** Assemblies are held every Monday at 8:35am in the school gym (or Tuesdays if public holidays fall on Monday). Parents are welcome to attend.

## Springbank School – Edge App

## Setting up the Edge app on your cellphone



- In the Apple/Play store, select the FREE app "Musac Edge"
- Once downloaded, you will be asked to enter a 4 digit pin, this will create your pin to access the app. You will then be directed to a screen where you can type your email then click "Forgot Password". This will enable you to create a password to enter the site. Your email will be the address that we contact you on normally, from school.
- You will then receive an email confirming your password change, if you click on the link this will open up the login screen from the Edge app.
- Once entered the first time, you can then access the Edge app, where you can easily submit an absence for your child, view their class timetable, see attendance reports for your child and see any any school announcements.
- We currently do not have the report function on this app, so you will see that the reports tab is empty. There is also a payments function that does not work, and we cannot "hide" from the view in your screen, but please disregard this as it is not attached to our invoicing system.
- And lastly, there is a function of a "record name" if you wish to record your child's name to help with pronunciation.

## My child is going to be away from school. What should I do?

To save calling, you can easily log into the app and click "notify school of absence" and follow the prompts. This also has the function to call school if you would prefer to speak to us.



## Car Park Safety

As we start a new school year, it is important that as a school community we work together to ensure the safety of everyone in the carpark. The safety of our students is a top priority for us.

Safety measures include:

- Driving slowly at or below the 10km limit.
- Slowing down and stopping at the pedestrian crossing.
- Looking out for the judder bars and slowing down.
- Giving way to buses.
- No use of cell phones while driving.
- Holding your child's hand in the carpark.
- No parking in areas with the NP sign, non-designated car parks, or the bus bay.

If you notice unsafe driver behaviour in our school carpark, please contact us immediately with a description of the vehicle (and ideally a licence plate number), and we will follow up with the driver concerned.



## Springbank Sharing Shed

The Sharing Shed is ready and waiting for any excess summer produce, seedlings or flowers for our families to enjoy.

The Sharing Shed can be found at the top of the carpark and is a school community space for sharing. Our families can leave excess produce, eggs, flowers or preserves and possibly more as we go along, from home, to share with everyone.

- There is no charge. It is purely just sharing with other families.
- No baking please, as it is too hard to keep ants away.
- Please label and put on a use by date if applicable.

In order for the Sharing Shed to be effective, families must also take the shared goods. They are free to Springbank families, and there is no expectation that you must share anything in return. Of course, if you would like to, then it also helps the Sharing Shed!
