## **Selecting Word Wall Words: What Do I Post?**

Key terms and symbols from the content area that will be relevant all year

Key terms and symbols from the content area that relate to the current unit

General academic words that support understanding of the key terms

Meaningful morphemes (i.e. word parts) for your content-area

Allow for students to help choose words and create word wall graphics whenever possible!

## The Four 'R's of Word Walls

- **REQUIRE** that students use the words in all writing tasks (formal and informal), especially in quick-writes used throughout a lesson.
- Have students use the words as they **RESPOND** to each other in discussions, especially in quick pair-shares used throughout a lesson.
- Have students **RECORD** their growing knowledge of words in concept maps, note-takers, and/or word journals.
- REWARD students for noticing when others use the words.

<sup>\*</sup>To meet the needs of learners from multiple language backgrounds, students should be encouraged to write/converse in the language of their choice, to translanguage, to sketch pictures, and to use definition tools as needed.
