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THE DRAMA OF WORSHIP

O Lord, you have made us and drawn us to yourself, and our hearts are restless until they find their rest in you. St. Augustine of Hippo

This fall, we will embark on a new sermon series considering our Sunday worship. Practically speaking, we will be reflecting on many of the elements of our worship services and will ask the question:

Why do we do what we do?

The answer to this question does not lie in blind allegiance to tradition (*The church has always done it this way!*), a preoccupation with fads and novelties (*This is such a vintage and cool way of worshiping!*), or some sense of superiority (*This is the right way to worship!*). Rather, by reflecting on our worship, we will begin to realize that there is a deep wisdom that lies underneath the rhythms and practices of worship handed down to us by those who have gone before us in the faith.

As we will see, our worship liturgy has a narrative shape to it. In worship each week, God is both telling us a story and inviting us into that story.

It is the story about a loving and gracious God, who seeks us out and calls us to himself because he loves us and longs to be with us.

It is a story about a merciful God, who forgives us, cleanses us from our sins, and calls us his children.

And, it is a story about a God who enjoys being with us, invites us to his table, and then blesses us and sends us out into the world as his covenant partners to labor alongside of him as he makes all things new.

In short, during worship, God invites us to make his story our story.

Let us worship!

REFLECTION QUOTES

'In confession there takes place a breakthrough to community. Sin wants to be alone with people. It takes them away from the community. The more lonely people become, the more destructive the power of sin over them. The more deeply they become entangled in it, the more unholy is their loneliness. Sin wants to remain unknown. It shuns the light. In the darkness of what is left unsaid sin poisons the whole being of a person. This can happen in the midst of a pious community. In confession the light of the gospel breaks into the darkness and closed isolation of the heart. Sin must be brought into the light. What is unspoken is said openly and confessed. All that is secret and hidden comes to light. It is a hard struggle until the sin crosses one's lips in confession. But God breaks down gates of bronze and cuts through bars of iron (Ps. 107:16) Since the confession of sin is made in the presence of another Christian, the last stronghold of self-justification is abandoned. The sinner surrenders, giving up all evil, giving the sinner's heart to God and finding the forgiveness of all one's sin in the community of Jesus Christ and other Christians. Sin that has been spoken and confessed has lost all of its power. It has been revealed and judged as sin. It can no longer tear apart the community.'

<u>Liturgical Colors</u>: Liturgical colors can orient us to the season of the church year and help to engage our sense of sight in worship.

Green is the color for Ordinary Time, symbolizing the hope of new life which is ours in the life of Jesus Christ.

The small symbols you will see throughout these pages correspond to a "Key to Liturgy" available here or printed and found in the lobby at the Grace Kids Table. .

ORDINARY TIME: TRUST IN THE SLOW WORK OF GOD

Ordinary Time extends from Pentecost to Advent. It is the longest season of the church calendar. The name "ordinary" is derived from the historical practice of numbering (i.e., ordering) the Sundays during this time period.

The liturgical color for this season is green. This gives us a great clue on how we might hold Ordinary Time.

Green symbolizes growth. Through the power of the Holy Spirit—poured out at Pentecost—we can now grow in our lives with God. This growth—what the Bible refers to as the "Fruit of the Spirit"—is beautiful and organic, as God grows us from the inside out. But, like a field full of crops, our growth in Christ takes a long time. This reality should give us hope as well as kindness towards ourselves as we cooperate with the Spirit.

THE COLLECT FOR PURITY

Almighty God,

to you all hearts are open, all desires known, and from you no secrets are hid:

Cleanse the thoughts of our hearts by the inspiration of your Holy Spirit,

that we may perfectly love you, and worthily magnify your holy Name; through Christ our Lord. Amen. A collect is a prayer that is intended to collect or sum up the prayers of the community, typically following a four-fold pattern: invocation, meditation, petition, and doxology. The Collect for Purity helps us to hear God's word and worship by reminding us that we are laid bare when we come before him. He sees and knows all that we are and all that we bring to him.

We come to God that we might be shaped and formed by his Word.

"Lectio Sacra" means "sacred

reading." It has been the practice of the church for thousands of years to have

portions of the bible read during worship services. The

assumption behind this practice is that we are people who need

to be shaped by all of God's

word.

Old Testament Reading

Exodus 22:21-27

"Do not mistreat or oppress a foreigner, for you were foreigners in Egypt.

New Testament Reading

1 Thessalonians 2:1-8

You know, brothers and sisters, that our visit to you was not without results. We had previously suffered and been treated outrageously in Philippi, as you know, but with the help of our God we dared to tell you his gospel in the face of strong opposition. For the appeal we make does not spring from error or impure motives, nor are we trying to trick you. On the contrary, we speak as those approved by God to be entrusted with the gospel. We are not trying to please people but God, who tests our hearts. You know we never used flattery, nor did we put on a mask to cover up greed—God is our witness. We were not looking for praise from people, not from you or anyone else, even though as apostles of Christ we could have asserted our authority. Instead, we were like young children among you.

Just as a nursing mother cares for her children, so we cared for you. Because we loved you so much, we were delighted to share with you not only the gospel of God but our lives as well.

Matthew 22:34-46

Jesus replied: "Love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your mind.' This is the first and greatest commandment. 39 And the second is like it: 'Love your neighbor as yourself.' All the Law and the Prophets hang on these two commandments."

While the Pharisees were gathered together, Jesus asked them, "What do you think about the Messiah? Whose son is he?"

"The son of David," they replied.


He said to them, "How is it then that David, speaking by the Spirit, calls him 'Lord'? For he says,





always and everywhere to give thanks to you, Father Almighty, Creator of heaven and earth.


Therefore we praise you,

We Preach the Good News

We Draw Near (The Lord's Supper)

(All are invited to come forward during Communion. The act of receiving the bread and wine is a confession, that as you receive those gifts, you have already received the gift of a renewed relationship with God, through Christ. If that is not your confession, you may still come forward to receive a prayer. Simply cross your arms across your chest as an indication that you are coming for prayer.)

Communion Elements:

Cup: Wine or Grape Juice

Bread ingredients:Wheat Flour, Rye Flour, White Unbleached Flour, 1% Milk, Yeast, Vegetable Oil

Rice Crackers: Organic Brown Rice Flour, Organic White Rice Flour

Prefilled, factory-sealed communion elements also available:
Communion wafer ingredients: wheat flour, water, vegetable shortening (soybean oil, cottonseed oil).

Receiving Communion

We will come forward by rows, starting at the front. There will be factory sealed communion elements as well as gluten free crackers with designated juice and wine on the table at the front. Otherwise, there is bread to dip in either wine (tall cup) or juice (short cup).

GRACE KIDS If you have any questions about Grace Kids, email linn@graceseattle.org.

Resources for Sunday Worship. Children are always welcome to remain in the service. To participate in a class, children must be signed in each week with KidCheck, our secure check-in system and wear their printed name tag. Check-in stations located in lobby and downstairs.
