Most of us are familiar with imposter syndrome. When we experience it, we are convinced that we have no idea what we are doing and live in fear of being exposed as a fraud.

The beauty of Ash Wednesday is that it helps us deal a death blow to imposter syndrome.

Throughout the centuries, Christians have allowed ashes to be spread upon their foreheads on Ash Wednesday. What results is an absurd looking community of people all with dark smudges on their faces.

What is the point?

We spend most of our energy trying to convince others and ourselves that we have it all together. We want things to be tidy and well-contained. We want to keep chaos at arm's length. Ash Wednesday is a time when we purposefully stop doing this. We intentionally get messy.

We purposefully get messy on Ash Wednesday because the reality is—we are already a mess. Something is desperately wrong with our world; and something is desperately wrong with us.

We can own this hard to face reality because we are the Lord's beloved. Secure in the love of God–Father, Son, and Holy Spirit—we can own up to our own failings and sins and also begin to face the ways that we have been sinned against and harmed by others. In the freedom of the light we have in Christ, we free as God's children to roll our burdens and our coping mechanisms onto the Lord and find true life.

Let us worship!



THE LESSONS Old Testament Reading

Joel 2:1-2, 12-17

Blow the trumpet in Zion;
sound the alarm on my holy hill.
Let all who live in the land tremble,
for the day of the Lord is coming.
It is close at hand—
a day of darkness and gloom,
a day of clouds and blackness.
Like dawn spreading across the mountains
a large and mighty army comes,
such as never was in ancient times
nor ever will be in ages to come.

"Even now," declares the Lord,
"return to me with all your heart,
with fasting and weeping and mourning."
Rend your heart
and not your garments.

Return to the Lord your God, for he is gracious and compassionate, slow to anger and abounding in love, and he relents from sending calamity. Who knows? He may turn and relent and leave behind a blessing—grain offerings and drink offerings for the Lord your God.

New Testament Reading

2 Corinthians 5:20-6:10

We are therefore Christ's ambassadors, as though God were making his appeal through us. We implore you on Christ's behalf: Be reconciled to God. God made him who had no sin to be sin for us, so that in him we might become the righteousness of God.

As God's co-workers we urge you not to receive God's grace in vain. For he says,

"In the time of my favor I heard you, and in the day of salvation I helped you."

I tell you, now is the time of God's favor, now is the day of salvation.

We put no stumbling block in anyone's path, so that our ministry will not be discredited. Rather, as servants of God we commend ourselves in every way: in great endurance; in troubles, hardships and distresses; in beatings, imprisonments and riots; in hard work, sleepless nights and hunger; in purity, understanding, patience and kindness; in the Holy Spirit and in sincere love; in truthful speech and in the power of God; with weapons of righteousness in the right hand and in the left; through glory and dishonor, bad report and good report; genuine, yet regarded as impostors; known, yet regarded as unknown; dying, and yet we live on; beaten, and yet not killed; sorrowful, yet always rejoicing; poor, yet making many rich; having nothing, and yet possessing everything.

Gospel Reading


Matthew 6:1-6, 16-21

PRAYING THE PSALMS

Psalm 51:1-17 (ESV)

O Lord, open my lips, and my mouth will declare your praise.

For we have sinned against you.


Show favor to your people, O Lord,

Hear the Word of God to all who truly turn to him:



THE COLLECT FOR ASH WEDNESDAY Almighty and everlasting God, you hate nothing you have made and forgive the sins of all who are penitent:

perfect remission and forgiveness;

A collect is a prayer that is intended to collect or sum up the prayers of the community, typically following a four-fold pattern: invocation, meditation, petition, and doxology. The Collect for Purity helps us to hear God's word and worship by reminding us that we are laid bare when we come before him. He sees and knows all that we are and all that we bring to him.
