

### LETTER FROM THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR



Dear Friends of Vimy,

The Vimy Foundation had an exciting year in 2022. We marked the 105th anniversary of the Battle of Vimy Ridge on April 9th, 2022, launched our digital project Vimy: A Living Memorial, released our new five year strategic plan, and returned both of our flagship education programs, The Beaverbrook Vimy Prize and The Vimy Pilgrimage Award, to Europe for the first time since 2019.

Our team grew, and our Foundation grew, as a result of our amalgamation with our longtime commemoration partner, The Canadian Centre for the Great War. Now with an expanded staff of eight, and a museum collection housed in Montreal, we look forward to continuing to provide educational resources, digital programming, and travelling exhibitions to Canadians wherever they are.

In April 2022, I had the privilege of working with the President of the George and Helen Vari Foundation, Madame Helen Vari, and her team to open the Vari Gate in the Vimy Foundation Centennial Park. It was my first time working with her, though Madame Vari has been a long time and generous supporter of the Vimy Foundation. Madame Vari has since passed away, and I treasure the time that I got to spend with her and her

family last spring. I would like to especially thank Madame Vari's niece, Agnes Hilkene, for her guidance, kindness, and support, as we worked together to make the event as memorable as possible.

I would also like to thank our partners in our Vimy: A Living Memorial project; Veterans Affairs Canada, the Carswell Family, the National Film Board, the Canadian War Museum, and Canada Post for their support, creative vision, and participation. By the end of 2022, the project had been viewed over 11 million times, and we looked forward to providing a high quality digital experience to the thousands of visitors to the Canadian National Vimy Memorial for years to come.

Finally, to all of our partners, donors, students, board, and our staff, you have my most sincere gratitude. Our work is possible because of you and your commitment to the cause. I am so grateful to continue to share the Vimy Foundation vision with you, and to work together to continue to build the future, informed by the past.



The Beaverbrook Vimy Prize also returned to Europe for the first time since 2019. The recipients from Canada, France, and the United Kingdom were selected in 2020 and eagerly awaited the opportunity to participate in the program under more optimal travel conditions. Their patience was rewarded in August 2022, when the group visited Canadian and global sites connected to the First and Second World Wars in Belgium and France.

During the twelve-day program, which was generously supported by the Beaverbrook Canadian Foundation and Air Canada, students engaged in critical discussions and debate about major historical world events; presented individual and group research projects; and gained new skills which they will be able to apply to any number of future education and career opportunities. The group also had the exceptional experience of participating in commemorations for the 80th anniversary of the Dieppe Raid, in the presence of Canadian and French dignitaries, veterans, and fellow Canadian and French youth.

Thanks to the expertise of the education team leading the program, the students garnered new global perspectives on major events in world history.

### THE VIMY PILGRIMAGE AWARD

The Vimy Pilgrimage Award (VPA) program returned to Europe for the first time since 2019. Thanks to the generous support of Scotiabank, Air Canada, and the Love Family Foundation, twenty-one deserving youth from 9 provinces and 1 territory received the award for their impactful contributions to their communities.

The recipients had the opportunity to visit important First World War sites in Belgium and France and learn alongside their peers. To expand their knowledge and understanding of the war and those who served, the students completed individual research projects to honour a soldier or nurse and group projects to explore themes and topics that are not often taught in the classroom. A highlight for the group was their participation in the Remembrance Day Ceremony at the Canadian National Vimy Memorial.

Led by a team of educators and historians, the program continues to offer students unique insights into the history of the war from Canadian and global perspectives, in ways that are inclusive and relevant to the interests of youth today.

Two committees focused on programs as well as outreach and communication provide strategic suggestions on key areas of the Foundation's work.

2022 marked the 105th anniversary of the battle of Vimy Ridge. For the occasion, the Vimy Foundation travelled to France to commemorate the event and launch its newest digital initiative, Vimy: A Living Memorial On April 9th at the visitor centre at the Canadian National Vimy Memorial with our partners from Veterans Affairs Canada, the National Film Board, and the Canadian War Museum.

Since then, the Expedition mobile app has been downloaded more than 60,000 times, and multiple user testimonies have been added to the Digital Pilgrimage; the two complementary assets the Living Memorial project offers. It has become a key component of the visitor experience at the Vimy Memorial, as well as an innovative tool for active commemoration and allows Canadians from across the country, or people internationally, the chance to experience Vimy from anywhere in the world.

The Digital Pilgrimage also received a nomination as one of the Palmarès at the 2023 Numix Awards in Quebec for the Cultural Web Production Category.

The Vimy Foundation Alumni Council Celebrating Vimy 105

In 2022, members of the Vimy Foundation had the opportunity to participate in regular Remembrance Day commemoration activities for the first time since 2019. The day was marked with the laying of 11 wreaths at Remembrance Day ceremonies in cities across Canada including Montreal, Calgary, Ottawa, and Vancouver. Members of the Foundation also participated in 11 national interviews including a 3-minute segment on CTV Montreal exclusively featuring the Vimy Foundation. On November 4th our Executive Director, Caitlin Bailey, also participated in the opening of the re-designed Remembrance park in Verdun, Quebec, which included the planting of a Vimy Oak.

It was a pleasure for all of us at the Foundation to be part of Remembrance Day 2022 in person, and with so many other Canadians who made the effort to attend.


### Our new partner in commemoration

In the summer of 2022, the Vimy Foundation amalgamated with our longtime partner the Canadian Centre for the Great War, a not-for-profit museum collection that aims to promote and make accessible the social history of the First World War in Canada. Grouping the two organisations under one administration enabled the CCGW to increase its audience and broaden its outreach, and brought the Vimy Foundation access to its considerable archival and museum collections, housed in Montreal.

As the exhibition arm of the Vimy Foundation, the Canadian Centre for the Great War will continue to stage national travelling exhibitions, run in-school workshops in our home city of Montreal, and to collect artefacts and archives related to the Canadian experience of the First World War.

### VIMY INSPIRES TOMORROW

The Foundation ran its second full year of our community leadership program, Vimy Inspires Tomorrow, throughout the 2022-2023 school year. Vimy Inspires Tomorrow seeks to foster and develop leadership skills for youths between the ages of 13 and 17. After participating in six modules which draw on First World War history, student participants submit a compelling community-building project for the chance to receive a \$1,500 grant to achieve their goals. Our first grant recipient, Daniel Marques, was announced in the spring of 2023 for his plan to create a newcomers welcome group in Marpole, Vancouver. Applications for the 2023-2024 school year open in September.



### SHELL SHOCKED TRAVELLING EXHIBIT

As part of its travelling exhibition mandate, The Canadian Centre for the Great War completed the development of its 6th national travelling exhibition, Shell Shocked: The Long Road to Recovery, which is travelling to various museums and organisations across Canada in 2023. We would like to extend a special thank you to our partners in this exhibition, Heritage Canada, Veterans Affairs Canada, and the Zeller Family Foundation, for making Shell Shocked a reality.

The Foundation would also like to thank the Whitmer Trudel Foundation and the family of Robert Thomas Ruggles for their significant contribution to the Centennial Park in 2022, which will allow the installation of six custom entry gates in the park.




