EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

On March 17, 2024, His Excellency, Governor Charles Chukwuma Soludo, will mark his two-year anniversary in office as Governor of Anambra State, having been sworn in on the same day two years earlier. The announcement of the All Progressives Grand Alliance (APGA) candidate as the winner of the state gubernatorial election on November 2021, sparked widespread 9, celebration among the people of Anambra state. This enthusiasm was attributed to the Governor's distinguished track record in academia and policy making, which garnered significant achievements.

In his manifesto titled 'The Soludo Solution' the Governor articulated his vision for the state to become the most desirable location for various social and economic activities. In his own words,

"It is a vision of a homeland that is the preferred destination in which to live, invest, learn, work, relax, and enjoy."

His plans to transform the state into a liveable and prosperous homeland are anchored in four key areas: 'Economic Transformation and Enablers,' 'Social Agenda,' 'Governance, Rule of Law, and Value System,' and 'Environment.

This scorecard serves as an annual governance performance assessment, specifically focusing on evaluating the performance of the Governor over the past year. The primary objective of this assessment is to foster accountability and transparency within the administration. By systematically examining the governance practices and outcomes, the scorecard aims to identify key areas of both strength and weakness within the government.

The assessment is a data-driven analysis of some promises made by the Governor. AdvoKC tracked and rated (either Not yet Started, Promise Kept, Compromised, In the Works or Promise Broken) a total of 50 of the important promises made by Soludo during his campaign.

These promises would be assessed based on 4 categories namely:

- 1. Economic Transformation and Enablers,
- 2. Social Agenda
- 3. Governance, Rule of Law, and Value System
- 4. Environment

It is important to note that a score out of 100% will be assigned to each category to reflect the level of promise fulfilment.





METHODOLOGY

We define a promise as a prospective statement of an action or outcome that is verifiable. All of our promises list the source. We track these promises by staying informed about the activities and communications of the elected officials. following their official websites, social media accounts, Freedom of Information (FOI) act and reliable news sources.

We use Politifact style of rating, the promise meters have six ratings. The first three provide a broad picture of whether the official is making progress; the final three indicate whether he or she kept the promise.

NOT YET STARTED— Every promise begins at this level and retains this rating until we see evidence of progress— or evidence that the promise has stalled.

IN THE WORKS — This indicates the promise has been proposed or is being considered.

STALLED — There is no movement on the promise, perhaps because of limitations on money, opposition from lawmakers or a shift in priorities.

COMPROMISED — Promises earn this rating when they accomplish substantially less than the official's original statement but when there is still a significant accomplishment that is consistent with the goal of his original promise.

PROMISE KEPT — Promises earn this rating when the original promise is mostly or completely fulfilled.

PROMISE BROKEN – The promise has not been fulfilled. This could occur because of inaction by the executive or lack of support from the legislative branch or other group that was critical for the promise to be fulfilled. A Promise Broken rating does not necessarily mean that the executive failed to advocate for the policy. d Promise Broken.

** For the purpose of this report, a structured scaling system that assigns numbers based on the rating a promise gets has been used.

This score indicates that the political leader has not kept most of their promises and needs to be held accountable.






01: ECONOMIC TRANSFORMATION AND ENABLERS

Significant progress has been achieved in the realm of economic transformation over the past two years. Particularly noteworthy are the Governor's efforts to lead in patronizing 'Made in Anambra' products and the distribution of high-yielding seedlings.




Among the 5 promises assessed in this report, 4 are rated 'In the Works', while the commitment to organize cultural/historical festivals and carnivals remains unfulfilled and is rated 'Not yet Started'. According to our rating system, in this sector, the Governor has achieved a score of 48%.




02: SOCIAL AGENDA

H.E Professor Charles Chukwuma Soludo has made progress in the area of Social Agenda. Most notable is the declaration of a state of emergency on roads in the state. Several road projects have been awarded to contractors and are currently being worked on. Continuing the free education initiative for students from Primary to Junior Secondary School is another commendable achievement. One area where the Governor has really fallen short is in the creation of jobs for youths which he pegged at 100,000 yearly and has not even met up to quarter of that number in the last 2 years.




Out of the 23 promises considered in this report, 1 promise is rated 'Kept', while 'In the Works' and 'Not yet Started' each have 11 promises. Going by our Rating system, in this sector, the Governor has achieved a score of approximately 33%.






03: GOVERNANCE, RULE OF LAW AND VALUE SYSTEM

Minimal progress was recorded in this sector. **11 promises** were examined, and a bulk of them had experienced no progress in the last 2 years. The Governor's failure to publish his agenda, in addition to a delivery timeline and mechanisms, has kept citizens in the dark about how he intends to deliver on some of his promises and how long it will take.




From our research, 2 promises have been rated 'Broken', 1 promise rated 'Compromised' and another promise rated 'In the Works', while the 7 remaining promises are rated 'Not yet Started'. Going by our rating system, in this sector, the Governor has achieved a score of approximately 9%.




04: ENVIRONMENT

In the last 2 years, Governor Soludo has made huge progress in the area of Environment. He has made commendable efforts to expand and modernise cities in the state, encourage the planting of trees and provide basic amenities for Okpoko in Ogbaru, LGA.



11 promises were considered in this category. 9 of which are rated 'In the Works', 2 of which are rated 'Not yet Started' and 'Compromised'. According to our scaling system, this sector has a score of 53%.




SECOND YEAR SCORECARD

RECOMMENDATIONS FOR THE NEXT TWO YEARS

1. IMPROVING ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT

It is imperative that the Governor fulfils the promise to establish the Import-to-Export department within ANSIPPA as it can significantly boost the state's economy. By providing our traders with the support and resources needed to cultivate durable and profitable partnerships with overseas counterparts, and can enhance their competitiveness in the global market and stimulate economic growth. Prioritizing this initiative will not only demonstrate the commitment to supporting local businesses but also attract foreign investment and elevate Anambra State as a thriving hub for international trade.

It is crucial to prioritize the fulfillment of the promise to organize special Cultural/Historical Festivals/Carnivals in Anambra state, as it not only celebrates our rich heritage but also serves as a powerful tool for cultural exchange and economic growth. By hosting such events, we can showcase the diverse culture of our state to the world, attracting tourists and fostering a sense of pride among our Diaspora community.

These festivals also have the potential to invigorate local businesses, promote job creation, and foster investment in the tourism sector.

2. PRIORITIZATION OF SOCIAL ISSUES

Extending the scope of free education to include government-owned senior secondary schools alongside primary and junior secondary schools in Anambra State would not only ensure equitable access to education for all students but also align with your commitment to fostering educational excellence and empowering our youth. By removing financial barriers to education at this crucial stage of schooling, educational outcomes can be enhanced, literacy rate will be improved. Moreover, investing in free education for senior secondary schools will promote inclusivity, and the holistic development of youths, positioning them to become productive members of society.

It is also essential to promote inclusiveness so that people living with disabilities can also have access to quality and standard education without barriers like access to classrooms.

The reactivation and improvement of existing tourist attraction centres to meet international standards is essential as it has the potential to attract a surge in tourism which will lead to revenue generation and job creation for host communities of said tourist sites.

On banning the illegal collection of taxes and levies in markets, the implementation and enforcement of the ban is just as important as the pronouncement. Structures that enable market traders to report instances of illegal taxation should be set up.

The creation of jobs for youths as should be prioritised in the next two years, especially considering the significant gap between the current reality and the promised target of 100,000 jobs per annum. Collaboration between the government and the private sector is one way this target can be reached annually.

The promise to invest in the modernization of transmission lines to provide up to 18 hours of electricity in key locations is another promise that should be prioritised because of the significance of electricity in economic growth and social development.



RECOMMENDATIONS FOR THE NEXT TWO YEARS

3. GOVERNANCE, RULE OF LAW AND VALUE SYSTEM

Implementing citizens' hotlines will enhance transparency and accountability by providing direct channels for citizens to interact with government officials, voice concerns, and seek assistance, thereby fostering citizen engagement and trust in governance.

Deploying a digitally enabled land administration process will streamline land transfer procedures, and reduce bureaucracy, and promote investment in real estate, fostering economic growth and development.

Similarly, completing and operationalizing the state integrated financial management system will enhance fiscal transparency, efficiency, and accountability in managing state finances, ultimately leading to sustainable economic development.

Reviewing, amending, and operationalizing the fiscal responsibility law will ensure greater transparency and accountability in financial management, promoting prudent use of state resources and fostering investor confidence. Continuing and strengthening accountability initiatives such as publishing state accounts regularly will further enhance transparency and public trust in government institutions.

Establishing an Anambra State Hall of Fame and annual celebration of great achievers will recognize and celebrate excellence across various fields, inspiring others to strive for success and contribute positively to society. Designing and executing a reward system and public celebration of integrity, hard work, philanthropy, and personal responsibility will incentivize positive behaviors and foster a culture of excellence and integrity in governance and society.

Finally, mainstreaming the Igbo language as an official language along with English will promote cultural diversity, preserve the indigenous language, and foster a sense of identity and pride among ndi-Anambra.

4. IMPROVING ENVIRONMENT

It is crucial for the Governor to expedite the fulfillment of the promise to work with the Federal government to build embankments for controlling flooding in Anambra West. Flooding poses a significant threat to the lives and properties of residents in the region, particularly during the rainy season. By constructing embankments, the impact of flooding can be mitigated, protecting communities, infrastructure, and agricultural lands from damage.



CONCLUSION

Governor Soludo's Soludometer score after the completion of his 2nd year in office is **84.** This falls within the range of **50-99** and is **Fairly Poor (D).** This score shows that the Governor achieved only **33.6%** of the total possible score, indicating that there is a lot of room for improvement.

Governor Soludo's second year in office reflects both commendable achievements and lingering challenges. While notable progress has been made, particularly in the area of infrastructural development with significant road building underway, persistent issues such as inconsistent power supply and delayed completion of the vital water schemes in the state remain.

Our comprehensive assessment of 50 promises across key sectors reveals a mixed picture: **50**% of promises are **'In the Works'**, **40**% are **'Not yet Started'**, and **4**% each are rated **'Broken'** and **'Compromised'**, respectively. This leaves only **2**% of promises fulfilled and rated **'Kept'** indicating the need for enhanced efforts in fulfilling campaign promises in the next 2 years.

By focusing on improving economic development, prioritising social issues, ensuring accountability and transparency in the Governance process, and prioritising the environment, Governor Soludo can pave the way for a livable and more prosperous homeland for the people.
