DEPLORES Russia's invasion of Ukraine shows compelling evidence of gross

violations of international humanitarian law;

NOTES WITH since Russia's invasion of Ukraine in February, tens of thousands of

soldiers and civilians have lost their lives in the war and more than

13 million people have been forced to flee their homes;

FURHER NOTES the Russia-Ukraine conflict has triggered turmoil in the financial

markets and drastically increased uncertainty about the recovery of

the global economy;

SUPPORTS the UN General Assembly Resolution adopted in March 2022 during

its 11th Emergency Special Session entitled "Humanitarian

DEMANDS the Kremlin to immediately cease its military offensive and

unconditionally withdraw all its military forces from the territory of

Ukraine; and

CALLS on workers, their trade unions, and the broader society to bring our

voice together and urge world leaders to urgently find peaceful solutions to Russia-Ukraine conflict and ensure that victims of the

war are provided security and humanitarian assistance.
