





• USA – National Transportation Safety Board (NTSB) has released an investigation report concerning eventual crude oil release resulting from contact of ships' anchors with an underwater pipeline in San Pedro Bay near Huntington Beach, California. Post-accident investigation determined that the containerships MSC Danit and Beijing had dragged anchor near the pipeline months before the oil release. An estimated 588

barrels of oil leaked from the pipeline. Damage, including clean-up costs, was

estimated at \$160 million. There were no injuries.
