

Wyoming Crossroads Grants 2022 & 2023 Awards

Wyoming Crossroads is a state-wide public humanities initiative applying humanities perspectives locally to help Wyoming realize growth out of change. Wyoming Crossroads Grants support programs, publications, preservation, and digital media projects that dig deep into the larger themes and goals of the Wyoming Crossroads initiative.

General themes that can be explored through Wyoming Crossroads Grants are: Wyoming's identity, sense of community, connection to the land, persistence, and ability to manage change.

The goals of Wyoming Crossroads Grants are: 1) increase Wyoming's intellectual, community, social and civic wealth as the state restructures its economy, 2) apply humanities programming in new and innovative ways to reach audiences that do not typically engage in public humanities, 3) develop new partnerships with groups and associations not typically considered "humanities" or cultural organizations.

In 2023, Wyoming Humanities awarded 12 Wyoming Crossroads grants totaling \$106,485. These 12 grants serve 5 Wyoming counties and 8 of these projects engage statewide audiences.

In 2022, Wyoming Humanities awarded 17 Wyoming Crossroads grants totaling \$218,490. These 17 grants serve 14 Wyoming counties and ten of these projects engage statewide audiences.

2023 Wyoming Crossroads Grant Recipients

Wyoming Outdoor Council Programming Fremont County \$6,550

Homeland: A Wind River Film Premiere and Discussion of the Red Desert. A film screening and discussion that explores the historical, cultural, and spiritual connection local tribes have to WY's Red Desert and inspires a largely indigenous audience to visit the landscape and learn about conservation efforts.

New Moon Productions Programming Statewide \$10,000

Most Dangerous Women Documentary Series: Visual conversations linking the dynamic history of women's organizing with today's activists and leaders - this is our time! MDW places a focus on women becoming assured, visible changemakers confronting critical issues of their time/place, historically and today - as it aims to inspire audiences to locate and reclaim the often untold stories of their own communities. Off Square Theatre Programming Teton County (Statewide) \$9,000

Fault Lines in the Constitution: A Community Conversation. OST will host a community read of FAULT LINES IN THE CONSTITUTION to promote civic education focused on youth, including bringing authors Cynthia and Sanford Levinson to Teton County for visits in schools and throughout the community.

Breaking Through Polarized Narratives: Lessons from the Middle East. The project will unpack contrasting narratives surrounding a conflict via examples in the Middle East in order to encourage the empathy necessary to bridge lines of division and counter polarization in Wyoming citizens' own local communities.

Floating Through Recreation History on the Upper Snake River: An Exhibition at the Jackson Hole Historical Society and Museum. JHHSM, GTNP, and Dr. Youngs will develop a multi-disciplinary and multi-media exhibition featuring the cultural, environmental, and social history of recreating on the Upper Snake River for Jackson Hole locals and visitors.

Wyohistory.org Digital Media Statewide \$10,000

Grant will be used to jumpstart a new video series to accompany wyohistory.org's articles and oral history projects. The organization will produce 24, 10-15 minute videos, and 24, 30-45 second shorts with article authors. These videos will also highlight museums, libraries, archives, and interpretive centers across the state, as we highlight the contributors who work in those places.

Grant will support work with Kemmerer/Diamondville community members during an energy transition to develop a cultural preservation website that tells the story of place, identity, and labor history through objects that impart history, and personal/public memories.

Wild Excellence FilmsDigital MediaStatewide\$10,000

Feature length documentary film "Unearthed" will uncover ancient archeological artifacts in the Beartooth Mountains of Wyoming, bridging the cultural differences between native people and the modern world.

Eastern Shoshone Cultural
Center Digital Media Fremont County \$7,500

Grant will be used to support the development of a Shoshone language mobile dictionary app to improve language learning access for Eastern Shoshone Tribal members' as well as to host a public release event for the mobile application at the Eastern Shoshone Cultural Center at Fort Washakie, WY.

Sheridan County Travel and Tourism Statewide (International) \$10,000

Where Craft is King is a feature length documentary of the cross-cultural story of James F. Jackson's Sheridan Style leatherwork and the artistic cultural exchange Jackson has cultivated with Japanese leather artists via the International Leather Show in Sheridan, Wyoming. The documentary will highlight an international excursion from Wyoming to Japan.

Crossing the Threshold, LLC Digital Media Statewide \$10,000

Grant will be used to support development and production of a documentary film, "Crossing the Threshold" on returned veterans in Wyoming. The film will explore identity, connection and the need to belong, & and how we deal with trauma as a community.

Alliance for Historic
Wyoming Digital Media Statewide \$9,901

Promoting Place: A Preservation Communications Platform. Grant will be used to support the Alliance for Historic Wyoming as they build a comprehensive communications platform to share historic preservation stories and strategies with a broad Wyoming audience.

Heart Mountain Wyoming Foundation Digital Media Statewide \$19,940

A digital storytelling workshop for three Japanese American youth and three Apsáalooke youth, exploring their historical and cultural connections to Heart Mountain. The program will culminate in an intensive in-person three-day workshop in Park County, where participants will shoot final footage for 3-5 minute video shorts at the Heart Mountain site, work closely with mentors in the editing and post-production process, and finally screen their films at a free public event and remain available on the Foundation's YouTube page.

A second community Rapid Word Collection event to gather about 5,000 more Eastern Shoshone words and recordings to complete our Eastern Shoshone Online Dictionary. During this process, Eastern Shoshone Elders and speakers gather as a community to share language knowledge in small groups. The online dictionary is designed specifically for community members to easily update, revise, and expand content. The digital nature of this dictionary also makes this knowledge available to scholars and members of the general public who would like to learn more about Eastern Shoshone language and culture.

Teton Science School Programming Teton County \$8,950

Sharing Olaus and Mardy Murie's story through docent tours for Grand Teton National Park visitors and field education experiences for Teton Science School students of all ages, and Front Porch Conversations to draw in members of the local community to thoughtfully engage in conversations about our connection to the natural world.

Moorcroft Historical Society Preservation Crook County \$8,340

This project is a collaboration between the Moorcroft Historical Society, history educators and students at Moorcroft High School, and regional historians. This project will engage students in the humanities, think critically, and develop an appreciation for local history and those that pioneered the West Texas Trail. The project culminates in a digital and permanent exhibit at the West Texas Trail Museum.
