_____ Psa. 23:2	He makes me lie down in green pastures, He leads me beside quiet waters,
_____ Psa. 23:3	He refreshes my soul. He guides me along the right paths for His name's sake.
_____ Psa. 23:4	Even though I walk through the darkest valley, I will fear no evil, for You are with me; Your rod and Your staff, they comfort me.
_____ Psa. 23:5	You prepare a table before me in the presence of my enemies. You anoint my head with oil; my cup overflows.

MONTHLY BIBLE MEMORY GUIDELINES

1st-grade students must recite correctly **at least one verse** and its scripture reference at a time to an adult. **2nd-grade students** must recite correctly **at least two verses** and scripture references at a time to an adult. For **3rd-12th grade students**, the entire monthly Bible Memory selection and scripture references must be recited correctly to an adult in one sitting. Correct recitations of Bible Memory must adhere to the following guidelines:

1. The student will be allowed *three* prompts (a word given that has not been previously said by the student).
2. The adult may repeat anything that the student has already said correctly.
3. The adult may tell the student what verse the student is currently on.
4. The adult may tell the student if he or she said the verse correctly or incorrectly.
5. The student must say the section's scripture reference at the beginning of the section.

Bible Memory must be recited by the last day of the month.
The verification form is due to the student's Bible teacher no later
than 3:00 p.m. on the 2nd school day of the following month.

The Armor of God

_____ Eph. 6:10	Finally, be strong in the Lord and in His mighty power.
