“They shouted again, “Crucify him!”

Palm Sunday recalls the joyful entrance of Our Lord Jesus Christ into Jerusalem, amid all the shouts of “Hosanna to the Son of David!” Yet only a few days later, many of the people shouted, “Crucify him!” and “We have no king but Caesar!” And when given a choice by Pontius Pilate of him granting freedom to either Barabbas, a notorious criminal, or Jesus, the most gentle man ever to walk the face of the earth... they voted for Barabbas to be freed, and called for Jesus to be crucified!

Every day, we exercise the freedom that God has given us, by choosing what we will do, what we will say, and how we want to treat other people. Sometimes we choose to “crucify” them, not literally, but in many other ways: Insults. Gossip. At times, even with physical violence. The enemies of Jesus influenced the crowds to shout against Jesus, and those who knew and loved Jesus were too frightened to defend Him. So He was crucified. If we feel ashamed of our weakness and sins, we can take comfort from Saint Peter, who was so afraid of the mob that he swore that he didn't know Jesus! When the rooster crowed, he wept bitterly. But the risen Jesus later entrusted the Church to him!

Many people are still trying to “crucify” Jesus. Good people who respect God are still being persecuted. We hope that as the crowds shout against Our Lord, that we will always walk with Him. Today, we should pray for peace, and say, “Let it begin with me.” The world hungers for the peace and joy that only God can give.

DOMINGO DE RAMOS DE LA PASION DEL SEÑOR

24 DE MARZO DEL 2024

"Cristo Jesús, aunque era en forma de Dios, no estimó el ser igual a Dios como algo a qué aferrarse. Más bien, se despojó a sí mismo, tomando forma de esclavo, haciéndose semejante a los hombres; y encontré apariencia humana, se humilló a sí mismo, haciéndose obediente hasta la muerte, y muerte de cruz." —*Filipenses 2:6-8*

"Volvieron a gritar: ¡Crucifícale!"

El Domingo de Ramos recuerda la entrada gozosa de Nuestro Señor Jesucristo en Jerusalén, en medio de todos los gritos de "¡Hosanna al Hijo de David!" Sin embargo, sólo unos días después, mucha gente gritó: "¡Crucifícale!". y "¡No tenemos más rey que César!" Y cuando Poncio Pilato les dio a elegir entre conceder la libertad a Barrabás, un criminal notorio, o a Jesús, el hombre más gentil que jamás haya caminado sobre la faz de la tierra... votaron para que Barrabás fuera liberado, y pidieron que Jesús fuera liberado, crucificado! Cada día ejercitamos la libertad que Dios nos ha dado, eligiendo lo que haremos, lo que diremos y cómo queremos tratar a los demás. A veces optamos por "crucificarlos", no literalmente, sino de muchas otras maneras: insultos. Chisme. En ocasiones, incluso con violencia física. Los enemigos de Jesús influenciaron a las multitudes para que gritaran contra Jesús, y aquellos que conocían y amaban a Jesús estaban demasiado asustados para defenderlo. Entonces fue crucificado. Si nos sentimos avergonzados de nuestras debilidades y pecados, podemos consolarnos con San Pedro, que tenía tanto miedo de la multitud que juró que no conocía a Jesús. Cuando el gallo cantó, lloró amargamente. ¡Pero Jesús resucitado más tarde le confió la Iglesia! Mucha gente todavía está intentando "crucificar" a Jesús. Las personas buenas que respetan a Dios todavía están siendo perseguidas. Esperamos que mientras las multitudes gritan contra Nuestro Señor, nosotros siempre caminemos con Él. Hoy debemos orar por la paz y decir: "Que comience por mí". El mundo tiene hambre de la paz y la alegría que sólo Dios puede dar.


