At the start of this New Year, I feel blessed and full of hope about the future of kids in need who benefit from our Future Healers, Zoo Buddies, and Planet Savers programs.

I'm excited about 2023 because we have big plans to expand and help more kids whose lives have been upended by senseless gun violence.

Future Healers, in partnership with the University of Louisville Medical School, medical students, doctors, and staff, started in 2021 with 25 kids and now has more than 100 enrolled. We've touched the lives of more than 1,000 other kids through Zoo Buddies and Planet Savers in partnership with The Louisville Zoo and its donors.

In this final 2022 newsletter, we're highlighting how these programs have engaged our kids in recent months with volunteers including role models in law enforcement, entrepreneurial business ventures and the entertainment world.

I've seen the joy and growing compassion in our kids as they have fun experiencing nature and learning from medical professionals about human care in a hospital setting, animal care at The Zoo, and how they can be good stewards for our environment.



The two co-signed a children's book, "Adventures with Malakai," about Malakai Roberts, seven, a Future Healer member who was blinded by random gunfire when he was five.

The book, available on Amazon and other online bookstores, shows how Malakai overcomes adversity with a goal of inspiring children who are blind or face other life challenges.

Master P said Malakai inspires them, and he noted that Malakai, although blind, learned to ride a bike.

"This is who I want to be when I grow up," Snoop Dogg said. "I want to grow up to be like Malakai."











MAKING THE HOLIDAYS BRIGHT FOR HUNDREDS OF KIDS





ZOO BUDDIES GET INSPIRED AND LEARN FROM ANIMAL EXPERTS



Jordan Veasley, known as Jungle Jordan, engaged our Zoo Buddies at The Louisville Zoo with his knowledge and enthusiasm for wildlife.

Jordan, from Seattle, Wash., a wildlife educator, also inspired our Zoo Buddies with his own story of struggling as a kid and how his passion for animals and the zoo provided a focus and ultimately a career.

Jordan, who graduated from the University of Washington in 2012 with a degree in Environmental Science and Resource Management: Wildlife Conservation, advocates for the conservation of wildlife and for more diverse audiences to get involved. He spreads his messages through social media, a podcast, in classrooms and visits to zoos around the country.

We were also honored for Zoo Buddies to hear from Dr. Uneeda Bryant, a renowned veterinarian pathologist with the University of Kentucky Veterinary Diagnostic Laboratory.

Dr. Bryant, who mentors and encourages young people to enter science-related fields, explained the role of veterinary pathologists in safeguarding animal populations, determining causes of death and protecting human-animal bonds.

The Louisville Zoo session also gave the kids a chance to see and learn about real animal organs.
