

PROFILE MOST REV. SAM KORANKYE ANKRAH The Founder & Apostle General Of Royalhouse Chapel International



After graduating from Ghana's premier University (University of Ghana, Legon) in 1984, Most Rev. Sam Korankye Ankrah obtained various certificates in Christian leadership, management and entrepreneurship from Haggai Institute in Singapore and the Ghana Institute of Management and Public Administration (GIMPA) respectively.

He operates effectively in all the five –fold ministries and is a well sought after revivalist and international conference speaker, with passion for God and compassion for humanity. Through his philanthropic initiatives and dynamic radio and television ministries, he has transformed the lives of millions of people in Ghana and abroad. In recognition of his outstanding virtues and in appreciation of his services to the nation, he was awarded with the title, dignity and privileges of MEMBER OF THE ORDER OF THE VOLTA on the 3rd of July 2008 by the then president of the Republic of Ghana, His Excellency John Agyekum Kuffour.

In 2009, he earned the prestigious award of THE ANGEL OF THE YEAR from Pristine Hub Limited and TV Africa. In April 2011, Most Rev. Sam Korankye Ankrah received the "William Seymour" award for Excellence

and Humility in Leadership from The Azusa Revival Directorate based in the USA. On the 14th of August, 2012, the Board of Directors of Global Leadership Training, USA, in the presence of Her Ladyship Justice Mrs. Georgina T. Wood, Chief Justice of the Republic of Ghana, conferred on him the Global Excellence Award for Leadership for APOSTOLIC AND PASTORAL EXCELLENCE.

E.TV Ghana on Wednesday, 30th April, 2014 recognized and honoured him as one of Ghana's 100 Most Influential Personalities for the year 2013. On the 28th of February 2016, the West African College of Nursing conferred the title of Honorary Fellow on the Apostle General. During the colourful celebration held at the Royalhouse Chapel headquarters and broadcast via live stream to millions across the world, the Chair of the Ghana chapter of the College stated: "This award is usually given to an outstanding member of the College of Nursing or Physicians, or to Honourable Ministers of State. This is the very first time it was unanimously agreed that someone who does not fall within this bracket should be made a Fellow and rightly so because Rev. Sam Korankye Ankrah truly deserves it."

Most Rev. Sam Korankye Ankrah's call and passion is to touch his generation with the love and power of God. To this end, he has established the renowned School of Restoration for ex-convicts, commercial sex workers, drug addicts, armed robbers and other perpetrators of social vices, in an effort to rehabilitate and reintegrate them into society.

He also has a Scholarship Foundation for Brilliant but Needy Students, a Ministry to the Aged, a Compassion Ministry which includes food, clothes and medical outreach which reaches hundreds of deprived people in the remote areas of Ghana. As an educationist, he presides over the Royalhouse Chapel Christian Leadership College. He is also a Christian statesman, advisor to leaders in government, an author, pacifist and mentor to a number of religious leaders who have submitted to his apostleship. He serves on the executive board of reputable corporate organizations in Africa and beyond; and also on reputable religious councils and associations in Ghana. He is the C.E.O of Powerline Media Ministries and his radio and television programmes reach millions of people in Ghana and across the world.

The Apostle General is currently the first Vice President of the over ten (10) million membership Ghana Pentecostal and Charismatic Council (GPCC). He is happily married to the Rev. Mrs. Rita Korankye-Ankrah and together, they are blessed with four wonderful children and two grand-children. He resides in Accra, Ghana with his family.




Matilda Asiedu is an Associate Professor in Nutrition. She is currently the dean of the School of Biological Sciences at the University of Ghana and the President of the Ghana Nutrition Association. She earned her undergraduate degree in B.Sc Home Science (Food and Nutrition option) from the University of Ghana in 1982. In 1983, she applied and won an award to do a degree in B.Sc. Biology and Chemistry at the University of Bergen, Norway.

On completion in 1987, she continued to do a graduate program in Nutritional Biology at the same university. She worked hard and did so well that upon completing her Master of Philosophy in 1989, her supervisors found her a grant to do a Ph.D. program in Nutrition.

She was appointed as a Nutrition lecturer at the University of Ghana in 1993. From 1993 to date, Matilda has been teaching and supervising local and international students studying nutrition, food science, agriculture, medicine, dietetics, and public health at undergraduate and graduate levels at the University of Ghana. She is also an adjunct professor at New York University, Accra Campus, where she teaches Global Nutrition. In 2002, she won an award from Brown University Institute of Community Health Promotion, USA, to undertake a Master's degree in Public Health. In May 2004, she was awarded a Master of Public Health degree. Her work in the communities is driven by her passion for helping others improve their quality of life.

She has written and published over 35 scientific papers in peer-reviewed journals and co-authored chapters in books. Prof Matilda is not limited to the classroom but also plays an active role in University of Ghana sports. It is not surprising that in 2009 when the University of Ghana Sports Directorate was undergoing reorganization, she was made the Deputy Director of Sports (first female in that position), which she performed efficiently in combining with her academic work till 2011. Professor Matilda Asiedu believes all these achievements could not have been possible without the hand of God Almighty. She owes it all to God. She is a Lady Deacon and worships with the Royalhouse Chapel International, Accra, Ghana





Noble is the President of Organisation Development Institute, (ODI) Ghana. He is a Psychologist with a post-graduate specialization as an Organization Development [OD] Consultant. He divides his time between Africa and Europe, undertaking relevant Organisational Development (OD) & Management Development consultancies, training and research assignments or strengthening the capacity of local consultants to do so.

Before its accreditation, Noble was the Coordinator of the OCIC-UCC Partnership, which was involved in the OD Consultancy Skills Training, jointly mounted by the Organisation Development Institute, formerly known as Organisation Capacity Improvement Consultants (OCIC), and the University of Cape Coast (2003-2015), Ghana.

Noble has undertaken various short and long-term consultancy, research, or training assignments for the UN, USAID, DFID, GIZ (formerly GIZ, EZE, World Bank (Ghana), SNV, WHO, and African Union Commission.

Noble also assisted with various public sector reform programs, including the "Compulsory Competitive Tendering" (CCT) policy implementation of the UK government in Manchester, United Kingdom, the National Institutional Renewal Programme (NIRP) of Ghana, and the Federal Civil Service Commission of Ethiopia, Conflict Resolution and Team Building for the Leadership of Political Parties (Ghana) and various departments of the Parliamentary Service of Ghana. Noble was also the Coordinator for the Bury Metropolitan Authority's collaboration programme by the Social Services-Health Education-District Health Services and a non-governmental organization. Noble is the first and the only African to have received the covetous Richard Beckhard Award (RBA) in the thirty-five-year history of the International Organisation Development Association (IODA), USA. The

Award was conferred on him at the first ever World OD Summit of the International Organisation Development Association (IODA) in Budapest, Hungary (August 2010) for his outstanding contribution to the field of Organisation Development (OD). Education and Special Courses Noble undertook most of his tertiary education mainly in the United Kingdom, the United States of America, Sweden, and Ghana and held such qualifications as: International Organisation Systems Development, Gestalt Institute of Cleveland, Ohio, USA The Art and Practice of Leadership Development, Harvard University, Boston, Massachusetts, USA Organization Development (Advanced) & Management Development Consultancy Skills Training, Sweden & United Kingdom, respectively. PRINCIPAL'S SPEECH

INTRODUCTION

How good it is to give thanks to you, O Most High God, to proclaim your constant love every morning and your faithfulness every night, Your mighty deeds, O Lord, make me glad; because of what you have done, I sing for joy. Ps 92:1 & 4 (GNB).

President and Founder of the Christian Leadership College, and the Apostle General of Royalhouse Chapel International; Premier Lady of Royalhouse Chapel worldwide, Rev Mrs Rita Korankye-Ankrah; Guests of Honor; CLC Council and Faculty; CLC Alumni and Students; Guest, Ladies, and Gentlemen in the Lord:

Permit me to make this concise speech touching on the history of the College, academic programs, and achievement for this year for which we are here to celebrate the goodness of the Lord towards us.

HISTORY

The CLC was founded in April 2001 out of the vision of the President and Founder of Royalhouse Chapel International, the Apostle General Sam Korankye Ankrah, to train and equip men and women of God to transform the world through the gospel and effective leadership. The College has trained and graduated hundreds of persons, who are dedi-

cated to expanding the kingdom business as ministers of the gospel and providing leadership in various endeavors of their careers in this nation and beyond.

AFFILIATIONS

The Christian Leadership College is grateful to be affiliated with the Trinity Theological Seminary, Ghana which provides mentorship and direction to the College and admits our graduates who excel to continue their studies. CLC graduates have the opportunities to study at the Bachelor's and Master's levels at Trinity Theological Seminary.

PROGRAMMES

The College runs two programs in line with the approved curriculum of our oversight institution. The programmes are: the one-year Certificate in Ministry, and the two-year Advanced Certificate in Theology and Management. Classes are held in the evenings on Mondays, Wednesdays, and Thursdays, and our weekend classes on held on Saturdays.

FINANCIAL SUPPORT

The Apostle General and Royalhouse Chapel provide a full sponsorship to about 60% of the students and partial sponsorship /subsidies to all other students studying at the College. The church provides all the facilities, and the church also pays for the cost of running the College. Apostle General, we are most grateful.

FACULTY

The faculty of the CLC is made up of qualified and experienced lecturers from our supervising institutions and also from the Royalhouse academicians' pool with qualifications of masters' and doctorate degrees in Theology, Divinity, and Management. The College also boast of visiting professors with rich research and practical experiences to share with the students and faculty. The College is blessed to have the Apostle General of Royalhouse Chapel International as the President of Christian Leadership College (CLC), who presides annually at our Matriculation and Graduation ceremonies.

ENROLMENT

As a leadership and ministerial College, student admissions are open to persons who desire to make a difference in ministry and leadership. Some enter with diplomas, bachelor's degrees, masters' degrees, and other professional qualifications. We admitted forty (40) students this year for Accra and Takoradi Campuses. The twenty-four (24) students

for the Accra Campus will be matriculating today. The sixteen (16) Students who enrolled earlier in January 2021 being taught via online platforms, are participating virtually in this ceremony.

REGIONAL CAMPUSES/MATRICULATION

The College continued our Online School and enrolled students from Takoradi, Cape Coast, Koforidua, and Navrongo to join the Takoradi campus. One student enrolled this year from China. The Takoradi and Online Students are graduating with Certificate in Ministry today.

ACHIEVEMENTS

The College has produced several ministers of God who are into ministry, pastoring Assemblies of Royalhouse Chapel and some of our affiliate churches. CLC has also tutored leaders in government, the military, legal, banking, consultancy, and private businesses. To mention a few, CLC had the privilege of tutoring one of the best Chief of Naval Command in Ghana and also an Electoral Commissioner in one of the African countries (DRC) who came to Ghana to study at CLC and under the feet of the Apostle General. We shall be graduating forty-seven (47) students today, and we believe among them are future Heads of State, members of Paliament, Ministers of State, Apostles and leaders of the world.

At the 2020 graduation, we were privileaged to have as our main speaker, Rev. Mrs. Rita Korankye-Ankrah, who spoke on the theme 'Knowing Christ in Times of Crises". She brought us to terms with knowing the times we were in and to be wise as serpents to succeed. Her moment of address was an excellent encounter with factual realities on the ground and we know our speakers for today will be adding to her wisdom nuggets to conquer current challenging moments for the world.

Despite Covid-19 and its challenges, CLC was able to go on Royal Service, a six week missionary programme within the Accra Metropolitan area. In the year 2020, it was suspended due to the pandemic. The College instead conducted research projects to add to our store of knowledge.

CHALLENGE

Between the years 2020 and 2021, we have had a low enrollment of students due to Covid-19. The year has been very challenging for the students as the majority are facing employment challenges. With some having to depend on the SRC and individuals for their upkeep. The

result was that some could not finish what they had started.

STUDENTS' REPRESENTATIVE COUNCIL (SRC)

The leadership of the College's Students' Representative Council (SRC) supports management in running the school through various contributions and handling of issues that relate to student welfare, discipline, and progress. The SRC leadership has been very responsible and accountable to its members and to the college. Transitions to new leadership have also been handled in very matured and professional ways that we are all proud of.

ALUMNI

The management of the College, together with the SRC for the fifth time, organized an Alumni Home Coming Season 5 this year, which hosted several old students in a one-day session of beautiful interactions, both present and virtual, with one of our faculty members in the person of Very Rev Alfred Mensah of the Methodist Church, Abura Dunkwa in the Central Region. He spoke on the topic 'Pandemics: Theological & Health Issues' (Covid-19 in Perspective).

GRADUATION

By the grace of God, we present for graduation, Fifty-Two (52) graduands today; fifteen (15) will be graduating with an Advanced Certificate in Theology and Management, and thirty-seven (37) are graduating with a Certificate in Ministry. Out of the graduating students (81%) are males and (19%) females.

MATRICULATION

Apostle President, today we present for matriculation forty (40) new students taking their oath to study with Christian Leadership College: Twenty-four (24) in Accra and sixteen (16) who enrolled online early this year in January. Out of this number, (33%) are females and (67%) male students. May I use this opportunity to encourage more ladies to join the theology, leadership, and ministerial training at CLC?

APPRECIATION

On behalf of the College, I wish to express my profound gratitude to the Council members, faculty and students body. Especially to the Chairman of the College Council, Minister Noble Kumawu who has single-handedly decided to sponsor some students with his lecturing fee.

CONCLUSION

To the graduating students, we pray that you go out there to be shining examples to the believers and transform the world as commissioned by the Lord in Matthew 28:19, by making disciples for the kingdom.

To the matriculating students, we say that as you continue to burn the midnight oil, May the Lord God reward your faith and hard work. To our cherished congregation coming to support your loved ones and the church, we encourage you that it is never too late to learn, as wisdom and knowledge are the main things in life. No age or level of education is too high to study at the CLC. You will encounter and know the God of the Apostle General better and enjoy Him more. As you join us to search deeper for Him, He shall be found by you at CLC. May God bless you all as you go to the world to touch and affect our generation.
