- A student MUST graduate with 16 Core Courses.
- 7 of the 10 core courses must be in English, Math, or Science.
- Core GPA MUST be 2.300 Math, English, Science, Social Studies, Foreign Language (PE/CTAE DO NOT COUNT!)
- 4 YEARS of English
- 3 YEARS of Math (Alg. 1 or Higher)
- 2 YEARS of Natural or Physical Science
- 1 EXTRA YEAR of English, Math, OR Natural/Physical Science
 - **2 YEARS of Social Studies**
 - 4 YEARS of EXTRA Core Courses

Freshmen:

Ask your counselor for a list of South Cobb's NCAA CORE COURSES to make sure you are taking the right courses.

MAKE A 3.0 GPA! DO NOT LIMIT YOUR OPPORTUNITIES. If you start with at least a "B" Average as a 9th Grader, it is so much easier to maintain this GPA throughout high school.



Recruiting 101 TIMETABLE

Sophomores:

Register with the NCAA ELIGIBILITY CENTER at <u>www.eligibilitycenter.org</u>

CONTINUE TO MAKE A 3.0 GPA!

Juniors:

- Check with your counselor to make sure you will graduate ON TIME with the REQUIRED number of NCAA CORE COURSES.
- Sign up to take the SAT or the ACT.
- Submit your scores to the NCAA Clearing House using Code 9999.
- At the end of the year, ask your counselor to upload your transcript to the NCAA Clearing House.
- CONTINUE TO MAKE A 3.0 GPA!

Seniors:

Finish your NCAA CORE COURSES.

Take the SAT or ACT again.

 Complete your academic and amateurism questions in your NCAA Eligibility Account.

 Have your counselor submit your final transcript along with proof of graduation.



Recruiting 101 CAMPS AND COMBINES

College One Day Camps:

- Communicate with Coach Hanson and Coach Wilson about what camps you want to visit.
- BE REALISTIC!
- Schools want to watch you workout and interact with you in person, then offer or move onto the next prospect.
- \$40 \$70 is a lot less costly than going for an entire week and paying \$350.



Recruiting 101 CAMPS AND COMBINES Winter/Spring Combines:

- Communicate with Coach Hanson and Coach Wilson about which combine you want to attend. We will VET it!
- Be ready to showcase your skills and be prepared for testing (40; L-Drill; 3-Cone; Height; Weight; Wingspan)
- UNDERSTAND THE RISK: A slow 40 time can hurt your recruiting; however, a fast 40 time can make you a superstar.

Guidelines:

- Make sure your contact information is correct. MAKE IT EASY FOR COLLEGE COACHES TO CONTACT YOU.
- Your BEST 10 Plays FIRST.
- Highlight or circle yourself unless you are a QB.
- NO MUSIC.
- NO SLOW MOTION/INSTANT REPLAYS.
- NO MORE THAN 4 MINUTES. NOT EVERY CATCH OR TACKLE IS A HIGHLIGHT.
- Ask your position coach for his opinion.

Recruiting 101 RECRUITING SERVICES Be Careful:

DON'T FALL VICTIM TO FALSE PROMISES AND GUARANTEES. If someone guarantees that they will get you a scholarship for a specific price, RUN!

- Please use your coaches and your own ability. WE ARE VERY CONNECTED TO COLLEGE COACHES, AND WE DO NOT CHARGE A FEE.
- Remember, we have the same databases that the services have.

Recruiting 101 SOCIAL MEDIA

Remember:

- College Coaches WILL follow you on SOCIAL MEDIA and monitor what you post.
- They are potentially investing hundreds of thousands of dollars in you.
- If you post something that makes you look bad, they will TAKE AWAY your OFFER!
- IS IT WORTH THE RISK???



Recruiting 101 ADVICE

Player:

- Be PROACTIVE. If a coach asks you to fill out a Recruiting Form on-line, DO IT, regardless of the level!
- When you meet coaches, be friendly and articulate. YOU are selling YOURSELF and OUR SCHOOL to these coaches.
- MAKE A PLAN. Where do you see yourself playing? Is that realistic? What level does that school play? Are there similar schools? Is there a fall back plan?
- Put TEAM first and the REWARD will follow.
 The later WE play in the season, the more EXPOSURE you will get.



Recruiting 101 ADVICE

Parent:

- Be SUPPORTIVE. This is your son's decision, but you need to be there to guide him. Remember, this is a 40-YEAR decision, not a 4-YEAR decision.
- When you meet coaches, your FAMILY is being evaluated. Coaches want to know how your child will fit into their respective programs.
- Educate yourself about the schools and coaches you will visit.
- MONITOR GRADES especially CORE COURSES.
- LEAN ON OUR COACHING STAFF. We are here to help.
- TAKE AN ACTIVE ROLE IN THE ENTIRE PROCESS.



Recruiting 101 ADVICE

Potential Parent Questions:

- 1. What does the scholarship pay for?
- 2. How long is the scholarship for?
- 3. What kind of academic support do you give your players?
- 4. Where is my son on your recruiting board?
- 5. What is the time commitment for football vs. academics?
- 6. What majors do you offer in his field?



Recruiting 101 A COACH'S ROLE

I WILL...

- MAKE SURE THAT PARENTS UNDERSTAND
 THAT I CANNOT GET YOUR PLAYER A
 SCHOLARSHIP!
- Create a list of current prospects.
- Distribute this list to all coaches that visit our campus and send emails to all college coaches.
- Follow up with coaches and use Social Media as a Recruiting Tool.
- Make recommendations based on Measurables and University/College Requirements.



Recruiting 101 A COACH'S ROLE (cont.)

I WILL...

Present our players in a favorable light, but also be extremely candid.
REMEMBER, WE WANT TO FOSTER
RELATIONSHIPS WITH COLLEGE
COACHES, NOT BURN THEM WITH
MISINFORMATION.

- Vouch for the following things that ALL College Coaches ask about:
 - 1. Academics
 - 2. Work Ethic
 - 3. Character



Recruiting 101 FACTS

- In 2019, TENNESSEE made 440 offers to rising Seniors. REMEMBER, THERE ARE MANY OFFERS THAT ARE NOT COMMITTABLE, SO BE CAREFUL!
- DON'T GET CAUGHT UP IN THE SOCIAL MEDIA GAME....Many "OFFERS" are nothing more than fancy invitations to a college or university's summer camp.
- BEST PRACTICE: Ask, "Is this offer committable? If so, for how long?"



Recruiting 101 FACTS

- YOU ARE NOW COMPETING AGAINST COVID-19 HOLDOVERS AND BOUNCE-BACKS. If you have a COMMITTABLE OFFER, take it or it might not last.
- REMEMBER, A VERBAL COMMITMENT IS NON-BINDING FOR AN ATHLETE. The only thing that binds an athlete to a school is when he/she signs a NATIONAL LETTER OF INTENT.
