Expected Hatches for the month of May -

(From Arizona Trout Streams and Their Hatches by Charles R. Meck and John Rohmer)

Mayflies:

Little blue-winged olive dun (Baetis) size 20, afternoons

Black River, its East Fork and West Fork. Little Colorado River, its East Fork, West Fork, and South Fork. North Fork of the White River.

Pale morning dun (*Ephemerella*) size 18, mornings.

Black River, its East and West Fork. Little Colorado (mornings and evenings).

Stoneflies:

Little brown stone (*Amphinemura*) size 16-18, afternoons.

Black River, its East and West Forks, Little Colorado River, its East and West Forks.

Caddisflies:

Grannon (*Brachycentrus*) size 16, afternoons and evenings. Black River, its East and West Forks.

Midges:

Size 18-24. Primarily dawn, mid-morning, or dusk, but can occur at various times. All streams.

Lakes:

Little blue-winged olive dun (Baetis tricandatus) size 18-24, afternoons.

Speckled-winged dun (Callibaetis coloraensis) size 14-18, late mornings.

Midges (Chronomid) size 18-24, Primarily dawn and dusk, but could occur at any time.

Ed. Note: There are 111 different species of "Midges" in Arizona.

There are at least six different species of mayflies in Arizona with the common name of: Little blue-winged olive or Blue-winged olive.
