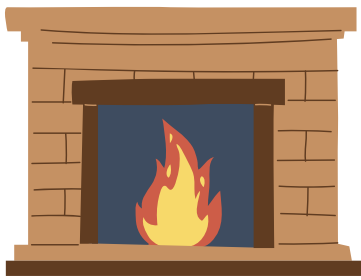




A COLD & FROSTY JUNE

DOUBLE KNIT



14.098/2
145 cm x 150 cm

Pattern

MATERIALS

CHARITY DK (100 g balls)
8 balls Malva 085 A
8 balls School Grey 011 B
4 balls Camel 145 C
One pair 5,5mm knitting needle

MEASUREMENTS

±145 cm x 150 cm

TENSION

15sts and 21 rows = 10 cm over stocking stitch using 5,5 mm needles and 2 strands together.

ABBREVIATIONS

foll(s) = follow(s)ing; k = knit; p = purl; rep = repeat; RSF = right side facing; st(s) = stitch(es);
tog = together; WSR = wrong side row

SPECIAL ABBREVIATIONS

C2B(F) = knit into the back(front) of the second stitch on left hand needle, then knit into the front(back) of the first stitch T2B = purl into the back of the second stitch on left hand needle, then knit into the front of the first stitch T2F = knit into the front of the second stitch on left hand needle, then purl into the front of the first stitch

INSTRUCTIONS

PANELS (Make 2 each in A and B and 1 in C):

Using 5,5 mm needles and 2 strands tog, cast on 48sts.

1st row: RSF, (k1, p6, k5) to end.

2nd row: (P4, C2F, k3, T2F, p1) to end.

3rd row: (K2, p6, k4) to end.

4th row: (P3, C2F, k3, T2F, p2) to end.

5th row: (K3, p6, k3) to end.

6th row: (P2, C2F, k3, T2F, p3) to end.

7th row: (K4, p6, k2) to end.

8th row: (P1, C2F, k3, T2F, p4) to end.

9th row: (K4, p7, k1) to end.

10th row: (P1, T2B, k3, C2B, p4) to end.

11th row: (K4, p6, k2) to end.

12th row: (P2, T2B, k3, C2B, p3) to end.

13th row: (K3, p6, k3) to end.

14th row: (P3, T2B, k3, C2B, p2) to end.

15th row: (K2, p6, k4) to end.

16th row: (P4, T2B, k3, C2B, p1) to end.

Rep these 16 rows until work measures 150 cm (or desired length) ending with a WSR, then cast off all sts.

FINISHING

Sew panels neatly in the following order: A, B, C, B, A.

Block work to measurement, cover with damp cloths and allow to dry



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Kit includes:

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1 hoop

Grey Aida fabric,

Lay out of the houses and sufficient DMS thread for all 13 houses.

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Sewing machine needles are the most changeable part of your sewing machine and they can change how your machine forms stitches. Understanding how the parts of a sewing machine needle work will help you choose the correct size for the fabric and thread you are sewing. Understanding the sizing information on the needle packages will help you purchase the correct size. Changing the machine needle is the first step to solving most sewing machine problems. Know about the needles and solve your problems faster than you ever dreamed possible!



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Needles range in sizes for different fabric weights. The lower the needle number, the smaller the needle and thinner the fabric it will be used on. Different needles serve different purposes. Using the incorrect needle can damage the material and cause skipped stitches.

Tips and Tricks.

- If your needle wasn't used much, return it to the pack backwards, with the flat size facing out. That way, you know which needles are brand-new and which are slightly used.
- If you hear a clicking or popping sound while sewing, replace the needle. It may have gone dull, it may be the wrong size for the fabric you're working with, or it may have bent slightly.
- When inserting a new needle into your sewing machine, the flat side faces away from you.
- Discarding your pins and needles? Don't put them directly in the bin! Instead use an old prescription pill bottle or another small plastic container with a lid to hold the used items. Only throw it away when it's full. Another alternate is using travel-sized shampoo bottles. Which ever option you go for, make sure the plastic is thick enough to not be punctured by these sharp objects.

Pippa's Bag

Cutting Instructions

From the main fabric (10" x 42") cut off a 2½" x 42" strip.

From the lining fabric (7½" x 42") cut off a 2¼" x 7½" strip from a selvedge side of the fabric & set aside.

From the remaining lining fabric, cut out 4 of the full petal shapes.

Sewing Instructions

1. Lining: taking the 4 lining panels, sew them together in pairs, right sides facing, from A to B, and then together again to form the inner bag. Leave a small opening (3") in one seam for turning through. Set aside.

2. Prepare Pocket: Cut pocket fabric into two pieces approx. 7½" x 7½" and sandwich wadding in between them. Stitch crosshatch lines of quilting 1" apart. Using the pocket template (lower half of petal shape template only), cut out the pocket from the now quilted fabric.

3. Using the 2½" strip of lining fabric, bind the straight edge of the pocket.

4. Bag Outer: Place main fabric on top of wadding and stitch crosshatch lines of quilting 1" apart. Now cut out four panels from this quilted fabric using the full pattern template.

5. Place the pocket on one of these panels, matching the shape, and pin in place. Now join the panels in pairs from A to B, and then together again to form the bag shape.

6. Make Handles: Cut 28" from the 2½" strip of main fabric, and a 1" x 28" strip of wadding. Place the wadding on the wrong side of the fabric strip and turn in the edges, covering the wadding. Top stitch down the length on each side.

Sewing Instructions continued

7. Cut in half to make two handles, 1" x 14". Now position one on each of the front and back of the bag, with the raw edges of the bag and handles lined up and following markings on the panel pattern. Handles should be on the outside of the bag.
8. Fastening Strap: From the remaining piece of 2½" main fabric, create the fastening strap by folding the strip in quarters lengthways with the raw edges concealed. Top stitch ¼" from either side.
9. Shorten if required at this stage. Fold in half creating a loop and position at the centre of the panel at the back of the bag (the side with the pocket in the front). Pin in place.
10. Assemble: Place the lining right side to right side of the bag and machine around the top. Ensure handles and strap are positioned correctly.
11. Turn out through the gap left in the lining. Close with a ladder stitch. Top stitch ¼" from edge around top of bag.
12. Sew a button on the pocket as a fastener. Then stitch fastening strap edges together according to the size of the fastener.

Note:

1/4" seam allowance is used throughout, & 1/4" has been included in all cutting instructions.



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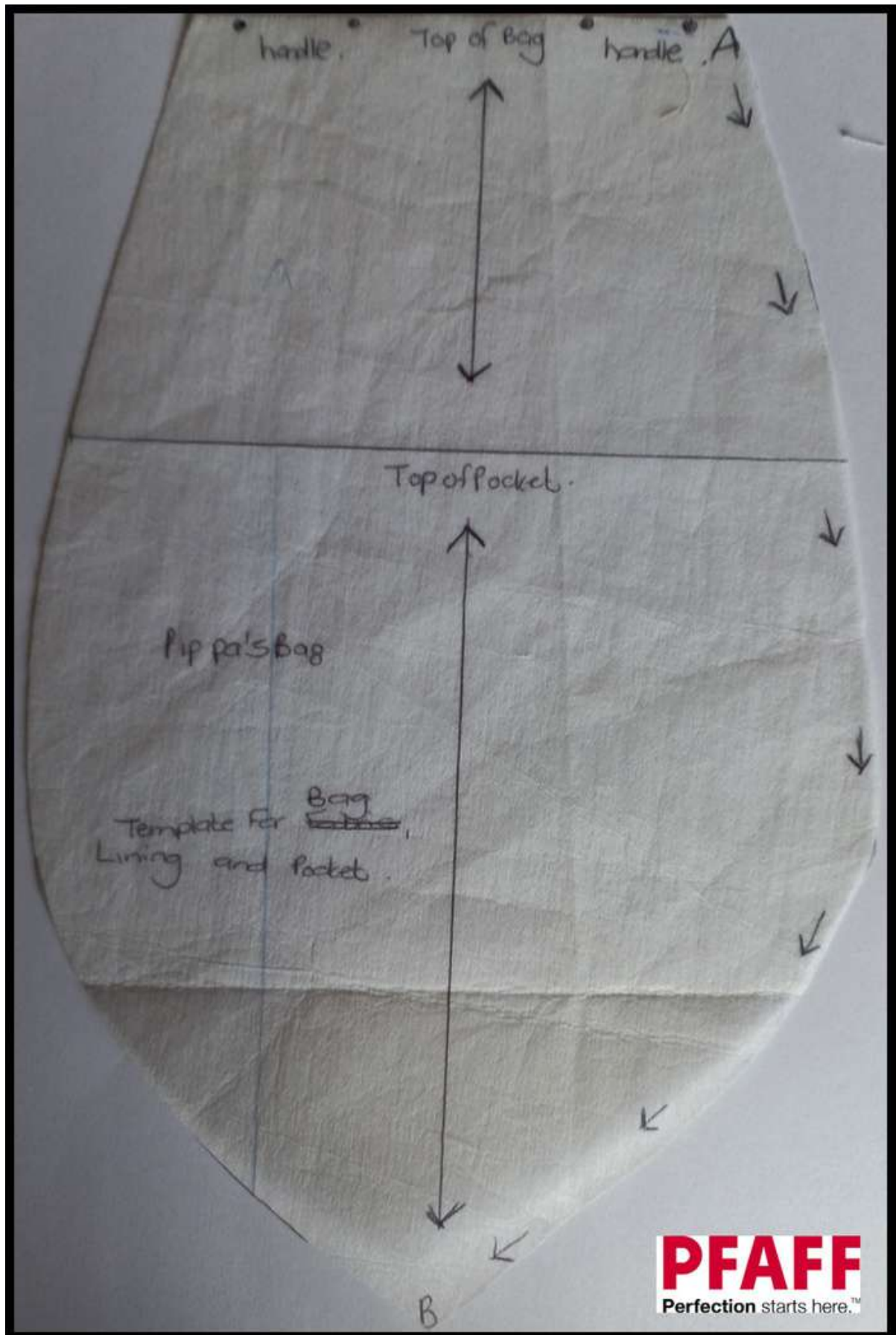


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A TIME FOR GIVING

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A guideline using double knit wool:
44/45 stitches on 4 mm needles
40/42 stitches on 4.5mm needles
35/36 stitches on 5 mm needles
