



You can also personalize your stockings with names, initials, or a special message. So grab your needles and yarn, and let's get started!







Front Stocking

With the red yarn, Cast on 8 sts.

1st row: Knit. Cast on 5 sts. (13 sts)

2nd row: Purl to last st. Inc1P. (14 sts)

3rd row: Increase 1 stitch. Knit to end of row. (15 sts)

4th row: Cast on 5 sts. Purl to last st. Inc1P. (21 sts)

5th row: Increase 1 stitch. Knit to end of row (22 sts)

6th row: Cast on 4 sts. Purl to last st. Inc1P. (27 sts)

7th row: Increase 1 stitch. Knit to end of row. (28 sts)

8th row: Cast on 3 sts. Purl to end of row. (31 sts)

9th row: Inc 1. Knit to end of row. (32 sts)

10th row: Cast on 3 sts. Purl to end of row. (35 sts)

11th row: Knit.

12th row: Cast on 2 sts. Purl to end of row. (37 sts)

13th row: SSK. Knit to last st. Inc1. (37 sts)

14th row: Inc1P. Purl to end of row. (38 sts)

15th row: SSK. Knit to last st. Inc1. (38 sts)

16th row: Inc1P. Purl to last 2 sts. P2tog. (38 sts)

17th row: SSK Knit to end of row. (37 sts)

18th row: Purl to last 2 sts. P2tog. (36 sts)

19th row SSK Knit to end of row. (35 sts)

20th rows: Purl to last 2 sts. P2tog. (34 sts)

21st row: SSK Knit to end of row (33 sts)















22nd rows: Purl to last 2 sts. P2tog. (32 sts)

23rd row: SSK Knit to end of row. (31 sts)

24th row: Purl.

25th row: SSK, Knit to end of row. (30 sts)

26th rows: Purl.

27th row: SSK. Knit to end of row. (29 sts)

28th row: Purl.

Place marker at end of last row.



Knit in Stockinette Stitch until work from marker measures 8 inches.

Decrease 1 stitch across last row Work in K2, P2 ribbing for 3 inches, ending with a wrong side row. Bind of in ribbing.















BACK

With A cast on 8 sts. 1st row: (WS). Purl.



2nd row: Cast on 5 sts. Knit to last st. Inc1. (14 sts) 3rd row: Inc1P. Purl to end of row. (15 sts)

4th row: Cast on 5 sts. Knit to last st. Inc1. (21 sts) 5th row: Inc1P. Purl to end of row. (22 sts)

6th row: Cast on 4 sts. Knit to last st. Inc1. (27 sts) 7th row: Inc1P. Purl to end of row. (28 sts)

8th row: Cast on 3 sts. Knit to end of row. (31 sts)

9th row: Inc1P. Purl to end of row. (32 sts)
10th row: Cast on 3 sts. Knit to end of row. (35 sts)

11th row: Purl.

12th row: Cast on 2 sts. Knit to end of row. (37 sts)

13th row: P2tog. Purl to last st. Inc1P. (37 sts)

14th row: Inc1. Knit to end of row. (38 sts)

15th row: P2tog. Purl to last st. Inc1P. (38 sts)

16th row: Inc1. Knit to last 2 sts. K2tog. (38 sts)

17th row: P2tog. Purl to end of row. (37 sts)

18th row: Knit to last 2 sts. K2tog. (36 sts)

19th row: P2tog. Purl to end of row. (35 sts)

20th row: Knit to last 2 sts. K2tog. (34 sts)

21st row: P2tog. Purl to end of row. (33 sts)

















22nd row: Knit to last 2 sts. K2tog. (32 sts)

23rd row: P2tog. Purl to end of row. (31 sts)

24th row: Knit

25th row: P2tog. Purl to end of row. (30 sts)

26th row: Knit

27th row: P2tog. Purl to end of row. (29 sts)

28th row: Knit. Place marker at end of last row.

Knit in Stockinette Stitch until work from marker measures 8 inches.

Decrease 1 stitch across last row.

To make the cuff: Work in K2, P2 ribbing for 3 inches, ending with a wrong side row. Bind of in ribbing. Finishing: Sew side seams using a simple mattress stitch. Weave in loose ends.

To finish: Using the small and large pom pom makers, make pom poms and tie on to the stocking.







Wine cosy is worked using 2 strands of yarn. So either pull a strand from the outside and inside of the yarn skein or wind a small ball to use as your 2nd strand.

















R1: Using 2 strands of White colour yarn, make a magic ring, chain 3 (counts as 1st dc) 11 dc in ring (12 dc total).

Sl St to 1st st.

R2: Ch 3 (counts as 1 dc here and throughout), 1dc in same st as joining, 2 dc in each of the remaining stitches. Sl st to 1st st. (24 st)

Now work in even dc:

R3-12: Ch 3 for 1st stitch, dc in remaining stitches (24 st) Sl st to 1st st. Change to Scarlet colour in joining slip stitch of last round.

R13: With Scarlet and using a double strand of yarn, Ch 3 for 1st stitch, dc in remaining stitches (24 st)

Sl st to 1st st.

R14: Continuing with Scarlet, Ch 3 for 1st stitch, then, working in the back loop, this round only, dc in remaining stitches (24 st) Sl st to 1st st.

R15-17: Continuing with Scarlet, working in both loops, ch 3 for 1st stitch, dc in remaining stitches (24 st)

Sl st to 1st st.

R18: Ch1, sc in same st as joining and next 2 st, ch 14, skip 7 st, sc in next 5 st, ch 14, skip 7 st, sc in last 2 st. Sl st to 1st st.



R19: ch 1, sc in same st as joining and next 2 st, sc 16 in ch-14 loop from the previous row, sc in next 5 st, sc 16 in ch-14 loop, sc in next 2 st. Sl st to joining. (42 st) R20: ch 1, sc in same st as joining and around row. (42 st)

Hat Brim:

Using 2 strands of yarn, and holding wine cosy upside down (with the handle loops down), attach Scarlet yarn to the free loop of any stitch in round 14. Chain 4 (counts as 1st st), triple crochet in each stitch around. Join with sl st to 1st stitch and fasten off. Weave in ends.

The tie, scarf and nose and nose are worked with 1 strand of yarn as follows:

Tie:

With White, chain 85, sc in 2nd ch from hook and across. Fasten off and weave in ends. Weave tie over and under 2 dc around row 16 and tie into a bow.



With Red, chain 85, dc in 3rd chain from hook and in each chain across. Fasten off, weave in ends.

Nose:

With orange yarn, chain 5, sl st in 2nd chain from hook, sc in next ch, hdc in next ch, dc in last ch. Fasten off.

Use starting and ending strands of yarn to sew to face over row 10 in between button eyes. (I sewed the button eyes on first and then attached the nose afterward.)

Finishing:

Sew on buttons for eyes and snowman front. The black button eyes go on round 11. The red buttons are evenly spaced starting on rows 4 and ending on 7. Put a bottle of wine in the cosy, tie up the top and wrap his cute little scarf around his neck and you are good to



Brighten up your Christmas tree with cute fabric tree ornaments.





















Grab some Christmas fabric.

With a rotary cutter and mat, cut strips of fabric of various widths. For best results the strips ranging in width from 1" to 1 1/2".

After strips are cut, begin sewing the strips together. To sew them together, place two strips together, right-side together, and sew using a 1/4" seam. Continue adding strips until the piece measures 5 1/2" to 6" wide. Once you have enough strips together, press the seams all in one direction. Press the front nice a flat.

To cut the tree shape you need a ruler with a 60-degree line. Line up the 60-degree line along the top edge of the strip-piece. The right-hand side of the ruler should line up with the bottom corner of the fabric. Cut off the edge piece by cutting along the ruler on the right side.

Turn the strip-piece of fabric.

Line up the 60-degree line along the bottom edge of the piece and cut. You have the triangular piece for the tree.



To make the trunk of the tree, cut two pieces of brown fabric 2" x 2".

With right sides together, sew along three sides using a 1/4" seam.

Clip corners, turn right side out and press flat.

For the back of the ornament, cut a piece of fabric the same size as the triangle. You can cut it from the strippieced fabric or a solid pattern fabric.

Put the strip-pieces triangle right side up on the work surface.

Place the trunk along the bottom of the tree, centring in the middle, with raw edges together facing upward. Pin in place.

Pin a piece of cord to the top, facing downward toward the centre of the tree.

Pin the backing piece on top.

Sew around the outside using a 1/4" seam and leaving an opening of about 2" on one side.











When sewing as you approach the corners, stop and diagonally stitch one or two stitches before stitching the next side. These diagonal stitches will help reduce the bulk in the corners when turning right side out.

Clip corners.

Turn the ornament right side out, pushing out corners. Press flat.

Close the opening by either hand stitch it closed or edgestitch. Edge stitching is stitching around the tree about 1/8" from the edge.

This finished ornament will add a little country charm to your holiday decoration by hanging it on a tree or making it into a garland by attaching it to some ribbon or cord. They also make lovely gifts for friends, teachers, and workmates.

DID YOU KNOW?



Ribbons are the Jewellery of clothes, adorning and enhancing their appearance.



Ribbons have a long and fascinating history.

They are among the oldest decorative and adorning materials that have been used since the early Middle Ages.

Initially, ribbons were primarily used as a symbol of wealth by nobility and the upper class.

Over time, they became an integral part of the fashion industry, adorning both men's and women's clothing.

Ribbons were also pinned to clothing and wrapped into hairstyles, as noted by Chaucer in his work.

The history of ribbons extends beyond fashion.

Today, ribbons are everywhere and serve various purposes.

They are used as awareness tokens, holiday decorations, and much more.

Ribbons are narrow, woven strips or bands made from different types of fabrics such as organza, satin, and polyester.

These materials are commonly used for ornaments, decorations, bow-tying, and accessories.

The origins of ribbon-making can be traced back to the Neolithic period when people wove narrow and dense strips of fabric on small portable looms.

Impressions of warp-faced plain weave bands dating back to 6000 B.C.E. have been found at the Turkish archaeological site of Catal Huyuk.

By the 11th century, St. Etienne in France became known for producing lighter-weight ribbons.

The popularity of ribbons continued to grow during the 14th and 15th centuries as more tailored clothing developed.

In the 16th century, ribbons gained even more prominence due to their usage and acceptance by French kings and nobility.

Eventually, in the 17th and 18th centuries, women became the primary wearers of ribbon adornments as male usage declined.




