DEVELOPER MICHAEL O'FLYNN SECURES EXEMPTION FROM VACANT LAND TAX FOR 12 CORK CITY SITES

The Residential Zoned Land Tax (RZLT) is a new annual tax effective from 2024, calculated at 3% of the market value of serviced land zoned for residential use, subject to exemptions. It has been introduced to encourage development of empty sites. This article looks at the impact and cost implications of the tax for one property developer in the Cork region.
