NHS has spent £4million paying property taxes for EMPTY buildings in last three years

A freedom of Information request by the Taxpayers' Alliance has revealed that the NHS has spent £4m on empty property rates charged on redundant buildings over the last three years. This article looks at the detail of some of the properties, the work carried out by NHS Property Services, who manage the NHS portfolio, and the costs of Labour's PFI contracts.

This article publishes a Freedom of Information request asking 8 questions about evidence of the effects of double taxing second homes, when a collation of responses on the consultation on taxing second homes will be available, what the revenue raised will be used for, how second home owners will be identified, the historic uncollected council tax debt, what action is to be taken on totally unused or vacant homes, the rate of housebuilding generally and a specific example.

Welsh government facing criticism over second home tax that could turn tourist hotspots into 'ghost towns'
