Council seeks tax rise of up to 21% over two years

It is reported that Birmingham City Council has asked the government for permission to increase council tax by up to 10% each year for two financial years. This article explains that councils have to hold a referendum for increases over 5.5%, but that the government is considering making an exception for Birmingham. The article reports that a decision has to be made prior to next year's budget being settled in February.

The Welsh economy minister has defended the Cardiff government's plans for a radical review of council tax in the UK. This article examines the proposals, which are currently subject to public consultation, and include options for: a simple revaluation; increasing rates for more expensive properties and decreasing them for cheaper properties; and adding new tax bands, one at the bottom and two at the top. The consultation ends in February 2024.
