### Context

Future generations are by definition at the heart of sustainable development. As stated in the 1987 "Our Common Future" report, sustainable development is "development that meets the needs of the present without compromising the ability of *future generations* to meet their own needs." In spite of this definition, actions and discourses made in the name of achieving the Sustainable Development Goals and long-term sustainability seem to be stuck in a short-term mindset.

A recent 2023 brief by the UN Secretary-General entitled "<u>To Think and Act for Future Generations</u>" reminds us that "[p]rivilege and poverty both transmit powerfully across generations" and urges us to **act with future generations in mind to fight inequality**. This is an important recognition of the structural nature of inequality, one which cannot be overcome by individuals, communities, or even countries alone. The struggle for **equality calls for a long-term perspective**, one that uses *hindsight* to account for injustices of the past coupled with *foresight* to understand how to transform our societies and re-design systems around human and planetary centred values so that they become just and inclusive, now and in the future.

Through an inter-generational dialogue, this **event will discuss what's next in the quest for equity and solidarity amongst generations,** including those not yet born, and how to strengthen long-term sustainability in a systematic way, by approaching sustainability though the lens of inter-generational impact.

#### **Format**

The conversation seeks to capitalize on International Geneva's expertise as a hub for forward-looking multilateralism and sustainable futures, and to **build momentum ahead of the SDG Summit that will take place in September in New York**. The SDG summit will act as a mid-point, high-level governmental and multistakeholder forum to take stock on the SDGs and accelerate action towards 2030.

As part of a partnership between the Graduate Institute and UN Geneva, this so "What's Next?" dialogue series aim to unpack new perspectives and insight on the SDGs and long-term sustainability. Through interactive dialogues, sustainability actors from the Geneva ecosystem and beyond will share their perspectives on what's next in this dynamic and evolving space.
