Biathlon Canada is excited to announce that Andrew Chisholm and Helene Jørgensen have been named National Team Coaches. In this role, they will assist Head Coach, Justin Wadsworth in leading the Senior National Team. Through the competitive season, they will coach on the World Cup and IBU Cup circuits.

Andrew Chisholm is a long-time Biathlon Canada staff member, working most recently as National Team Multimark. In this role, Andrew was a principle wax technician on the World Cup circuit and he led the Canadian winter snow sports and Own The Podium in the creation of the Service Technician Association of Canada (STAC). This past season, Andrew was the interim World Cup Team Lead and Shooting Coach and supported best-ever performances for a number of athletes.

Helene Jørgensen is a Norwegian-born biathlete who moved to Canada in 2015 to complete a Masters and PhD in Coaching Studies and Sport Psychology at the University of Alberta. While pursuing her studies, Helene has been an active biathlon coach at the club and training centre levels. From 2015 to 2020 she coached at Edmonton Nordic Ski Club and, in 2022–23, was the Assistant Coach of the Biathlon Alberta Training Centre. Jørgensen's PhD is focused on personal development in elite sport environments and she expects to defend her thesis this fall.
