Dear friends,

We are beyond delighted to welcome you to the fourth year of the Nature Festival and introduce you to the 2023 theme: The Nature of Home.

This year we invite you to join us on a 400 event exploration: what does it mean to belong? How do we build an identity and relationship with nature over a life? What makes a home?

We'll begin our journey with a family picnic and Welcome to Country from Ngangki Warra at the iconic SA home Carrick Hill. We'll then trace traditions through food, with immersive dinners by the likes of Poh and Andre's Cucina and Warndu's Rebecca Sullivan and Damien Coulthard, and whimsical, practical Pickle parties with Paul West and Green Adelaide.

We'll explore Australia's oldest sense of home with a broad range of Aboriginal Culture events including forthcoming Kaurna language sessions with our Cultural Ambassador Jack Buckskin. We'll deepen the inquiry with workshops and talks like Plant Kin: tracing home through food, seed, and medicine, a stunning collaboration between Parwana Afghan Kitchen's Durkhanai Ayubi and Keitha Thuy Young of Seed Medicine Garden.

We'll gather in community for art, music and dance, including a world premier of Kaurna Yerta: The Seasons, a cinematic concert, dance, and ceremony celebrating the six Kaurna seasons. We'll investigate the nature of home for the human and more-than-human worlds with the likes of Professor Hugh Possingham, our bird lover in residence.

All told, we hope you come away with a renewed remembrance of your own relationship with nature, a stronger sense of belonging to your community, and the deep, quiet peace of feeling at home in nature, wherever you are.

Nature is calling, come home.
