ABOUT US

The Classical Academies are an organization of award-winning, tuition-free, California public charter schools serving North San Diego County since 1999. The Classical Academies offer a flexible, personalized educational environment that blends the best of independent study and the traditional classroom experience. These hybrid programs are uniquely designed to encourage students to explore their interests, accommodate their learning style, and reach their maximum potential of becoming thinkers, communicators, and achievers.

At Coastal Academy, class sizes are small, students are known by name, and parents are invited to participate in all educational and social activities. Teachers and staff challenge and encourage students in academic and character development. The mission of Coastal Academy is to partner with parents to inspire each student to think critically, communicate effectively, and achieve excellence by providing academic choice.

TRACK A & B (GRADES K-6)

The two-day workshop option allows students to learn in a classroom setting on campus two days per week. Students complete assignments at home three days per week with parent supervision. The workshops consist of math, language arts, science, art, technology, and music. School days are traditional, with scheduled recess and lunch breaks. Workshops are offered on Tuesday and Thursday (Track A) or Wednesday and Friday (Track B), from 8:00 am to 2:30 pm. Workshops are taught by California credentialed teachers.

TRACK C (GRADES TK-8)

Track C is a full-time, five day independent study option that is directed by a parent or guardian. Learning is accomplished at home and optional lesson plans and curriculum are supplied by Coastal Academy. Track C allows greater flexibility with curriculum selection. Each family is assigned an Educational Specialist who serves as a resource and advocate. Students will conference with their Educational Specialist every six weeks to review learning objectives and present work samples. Track C students are invited to participate in optional on-campus classes through the C'lectives program. These classes include a wide array of both core and supplemental

classes including Spanish, history, science, math, literature, music, art, physical education, computers, and more. Throughout the year there are many field trips and extra curricular activities for students to participate in that encourage friendships and build community.

TRACK M (GRADES 7-8)

Middle school students have the option of participating in M Track. M Track students attend class on Tuesdays, Wednesdays, and Thursdays and receive instruction in math, language arts, history, and science. Students complete assignments at home on Mondays and Fridays. M Track prepares students for high school as they take greater responsibility for daily homework and project-based learning.



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
