

Assisting Antwon Part 1

Primary DQ Element: Frame Components - Purpose, Perspective, Scope

Time Required: 30 Minutes

Learning Outcomes:

Students will recognize:

The decision frame is made up of the decisions Purpose, Perspective and Scope.

- Purpose What kind of picture do I want?
- Perspective From where do I want to take the picture?
- Scope What do I want to include in the picture?

Students will apply these concepts to a decision made by a student who was a little younger than they are who had a big decision with a big impact on his life.

Instructions:

Exercise:

- 1. Set up students to watch the video with the intent to answer the questions at the top of the workbook page (they are easy and important for focus and understanding).
- 2. Students watch the video.
- 3. Highlight the elements of the Decision Frame (Purpose, Perspective, Scope) that are relevant for the activity and set students up to understand the graphic organizer for Antwon's decision.
- 4. The table/organizer is built around Values (what you want/don't want) and three Frames: Having Fun with Friends, Getting Better at Football, And Getting the Best Education.
- 5. Create student groups that can focus on completing one of the three decision frames.
- 6. Once each group has completed their frame in the table/graphic organizer, they present out to class at large. While hearing others, individuals can finish completing the table.





Lecture:

FRAMING IS CLARIFYING THE SITUATION WE'RE GOING TO SOLVE. BY SITUATION, WE MEAN THE PROBLEM OR OPPORTUNITY THAT GIVES RISE TO THE NEED TO MAKE A DECISION.



What is it that we are deciding? What is it not? What will we take as given? What goals do we wish to achieve? Getting a great answer to a poorly framed problem or opportunity is useless. Comparing framing to picture taking, framing is like having a camera with a zoom lens to move in or out in perspective.

PURPOSE - WHAT KIND OF PICTURE DO I WANT?

PERSPECTIVE - FROM WHERE DO I WANT TO TAKE THE PICTURE?

SCOPE - WHAT DO I WANT TO INCLUDE IN THE PICTURE?

FOR EXAMPLE: I FEEL THAT I NEED MORE MONEY AND I WANT TO ADDRESS THE PROBLEM. THERE ARE MANY WAYS TO APPROACH THIS, LIKE: HOW CAN I EARN THE MONEY? HOW DO I GET IT OUT OF MY PARENTS? MAYBE I DON'T REALLY NEED IT?

Debrief:

- Do you think that Antwon would have made this decision on his own?
- What was the impact on his life?
- WHY DO YOU THINK HE MADE THIS VIDEO? WHAT WAS HE TRYING TO COMMUNICATE TO YOU?
