- **Program Description:** This 12-session Zoom course is partial fulfillment of Step 2 of the 10 Steps to Successful Breastfeeding. The course is built on the Baby-FriendlyUSA[™] outline.
- Course Outline:
 - Zoom sessions 1-4: Brief history of infant feeding. International, national, and local breastfeeding organizations. Teaching pregnant people with cultural sensitivity and humility. Breastfeeding as a public health strategy, including social determinants of health. The Baby Friendly[™] Hospital Initiative.
 - **Zoom sessions 5- 8:** Anatomy and physiology of milk making. The value of skin-to-skin care. Assisting parents of term infants. Identifying hallmarks of effective breastfeeding. Supporting breastfeeding and human milk feeding in the NICU. Teaching bottle-feeding. Clinical guidelines for supplementation. Breastfeeding the baby with special health care needs.
 - **Zoom sessions 9- 12:** Contraindications to breastfeeding. Management techniques for common breastfeeding problems in the first weeks. Support for hospital discharge. Returning to work. Using pumps, aides and devices. Hospital policies that protect promote and support exclusive breastfeeding.
