Scholarship Awards

Scholarships are available for entry into Year 9 for pupils who demonstrate excellence in one or more of these areas:

- Academia (including Computer Science)
- Sport
- Performing and Creative Arts (including Art, Drama, Music and Musical Theatre)
- Service and Leadership

Other areas may be considered at the Headmaster's discretion.

All scholarships are awarded solely on merit and are assessed through competitive examinations, assessments and interviews.

The financial value of scholarships will vary between both individual candidates and the different disciplines. However, whatever the financial worth of the award, we value all scholars equally, and indeed view recognition as a scholar as the prime reward. Scholarship awards are generally capped at approximately 20% of fees and the majority of awards will be smaller. If scholars require further support beyond the scholarship award to enable them to attend the school, supplementary 'meanstested' bursaries are available. Further details of the process of applying for a bursary can be found on the website. Pupils applying for a scholarship at 11+ and 13+ would usually have been recommended by their current school.

Scholarships are competitive assessments and there are only a limited number of awards available each year. Whilst we welcome applications from suitable candidates, it is inevitable that there will be some disappointment at the outcome. We would urge candidates to apply as much for the invaluable experience of the process as for any expectation of reward. An application pack is attached. Please indicate on the application which category you are applying for and complete the appropriate pages.

Candidates with strengths in more than one area will be considered for an all-round 'Brian Jay' award at the discretion of the Head.

ALL candidates MUST complete Sections 1 and 2 of the forms in addition to the pages relating to their specialist areas.

Application Deadline: Monday, 8th January 2024, 4.00pm

Assessments: Week commencing 5th February 2024

Procedures and Regulations

The following should be noted before completing the application form:

- All Scholarship candidates must be formally registered with the school before sitting for an award (Registration Forms are available from the Admissions Registrar headspa@greatballard.co.uk);
- Applicants may only apply for a maximum of three scholarship awards;
- All 13+ Scholarships are 'continuation awards', given on the understanding that recipients will continue through to GCSE at the end of Year 11 at the School;
- Acceptance of an award must be received by the date stated in the offer letter;
- It is an explicit condition of any Scholarship that the financial details of the offer of a Scholarship remain confidential between Parents and Great Ballard School. It is our belief that the honour of being a Scholar is the reward for Pupils and that the financial element of the award is a confidential contract between the Parents and the School;

Applicants must supply a recent school report with this application.

All candidates will take assessments in English (a combination of grammar, comprehension and creative writing tasks) and Maths (this will involve general calculation work, problem-solving and application of Maths skills). No preparation will be required for these tests.

All applicants will participate in a group exercise involving problem-solving tasks and discussion on the assessment day. All applicants will also be interviewed by the Head about their personal statement and about their interests.

Art Application

Candidates should bring a selection of their work which could be in the form of a portfolio- this should not be all the work, but the best work. It can include paintings, drawings, photographs, textiles, collage or any other 2D art work. Sculptures do not need to be brought in person but good photos will suffice. Try to be selective; there will not be time to talk about everything.

There should be some work created of a pupil's own volition, not as school work, but for themselves. A good sketchbook can be brought in if it shows a variety of techniques. Candidates will be interviewed and given the opportunity to talk about their work, to discuss their ideas and future projects and to indicate any areas of special interest to them. They will also have a more general interview with the head.

All candidates will also be required to produce a practical piece of work on the day of the assessment.

Candidates will be interviewed and given the opportunity to talk about their musical tastes and talents, and to discuss any future projects and any areas of special interest to them. They will also have a more general interview with the Head.
