MAIN POINT:

SUMMARY:

WEEKS 8-11

FOR THE LOVE OF GOD ROMANS 8

MAIN POINT:

How Jesus transforms the way we live

SUMMARY:

In this series, we studied what's been called the "greatest chapter of the greatest letter ever written." In Romans 8, the Apostle Paul powerfully details our new life in the Spirit, our adoption into God's family, God's sanctifying work in our present sufferings and our future glory, and our final triumph because of God's everlasting and inseparable love.
