

Academics

Bernard Juarez Class of 1971






Bernard Juarez was an exceptional educator with humble beginnings. Born in 1953 in Los Angeles to a single 15 year-old mother, he experienced the first Watts Riots—a trauma that he would carry throughout his life. The oldest of nine, Bernard grew up watching his mother work tirelessly to support her family. His mother's work ethic was passed on to Bernard and served as the root of his success. Bernard moved to Oceanside as a young man where he attended Oceanside High School from 1967 to 1971. He was active in music and track & field becoming a world-class hurdler and pole-vaulter. Sports opened doors that

he had never imagined: traveling around the world, later coaching and competing as a Masters (over 40) athlete. He attended MiraCosta and the University of Nevada, Reno, on a track scholarship, and went on to graduate with honors from USIU while married with 2 young children and working 2 jobs. After earning his teaching credential he did his student teaching at OHS. With no teaching prospects in Oceanside, he moved his family to Hesperia and began his teaching career. In 1984 he began research on a project that would become a lifelong passion. Working on a system that would teach every student how to learn, Bernard convinced his school to allow him to develop a course in Study Skills. As a passionate educator, he advocated for longer school days, less vacation and a dress code for teachers, setting the standard by wearing a dress shirt and tie every teaching day. He believed that teachers who dressed professionally demanded the respect of students. In 1993, he was named "Teacher of the Year" for his school and the entire school district. It was one of the proudest days of his life. On April 15, 1997, Bernard died in a drowning accident, leaving behind his wife and two teenage children. His work on studying was published posthumously in 1999. Over 1300 people attended Bernard's memorial service, paying homage to the man who inspired, motivated and left a lasting impression on them.

Arts

Wendell Wright Class of 1967





It is a great honor to be inducted into the Oceanside High School Foundation Hall of Fame. After graduating from OHS in 1967, I attended MiraCosta College (1968-69). I received a football scholarship to the University of California, Riverside, (1970-71) and was hired by Arena Production before graduation. I am very proud to say that I have spent forty-two years as a "working actor." I have performed in everything from local and regional to national commercials. I appeared in numerous gueststarring roles on network television shows and in major motion pictures. Without hesitation, I am most proud of my work in

American Theater. I have had the honor of being in the resident acting companies of the Seattle Repertory Theater, Seattle, Washington and the Arena Stage, Washington D.C. With Arena, I had the unique opportunity of touring the Soviet Union in 1972. As a "working actor," I have performed everywhere from Moscow to Honolulu and all the places in-between. I also worked on the National Tour of "The First Monday in October" with Henry Fonda, which was quite a privilege. The absolute highlight of my career was performing in the one-man production of "Looking Over the President's Shoulder" at Ford's Theater in Washington D.C. Thank you to the Oceanside High School Foundation for my induction into the 2017 Hall of Fame and to my wonderful family for their support through the years.

Athletics

Holly Hartley Barth Class of 1976





"For God so loved the world that He gave His one and only Son, that whoever believes in Him shall not perish, but have eternal life. For God did not send His Son into the world to condemn the world, but that the world through Him might be saved." John 3:16,17 Holly learned these words as a youngster at the First Baptist Church in Oceanside where her family attended every Sunday. She was greatly impacted in those early years by the love of God shown her by her Sunday school teachers and at age 12 committed her life to Jesus Christ. She attended Tulsa University on a golf scholarship after graduating from OHS. In 1976 she

won the Los Angeles Women's City Championship and was a First Team Collegiate All-American at the University of Tulsa in 1978. Holly turned professional in 1979 at age 22, playing professionally in the United States for 5 years and then competing on the Japanese LPGA for 5 years, winning two titles and representing Japan against the US in 1989. In 1990, Holly married Ed Barth of Chicago, Illinois. After moving into a hurting community in Chicago, they realized that sports, especially baseball, could help keep children off the streets. Along with other families, they helped over 600 children who joined their baseball league. The children of the families that shared this vision all participated and learned through their varied experiences of the faithfulness of God. The Barths now partner with a group called "Breakthrough Urban Ministries" in the Garfield Park area of Chicago. Holly is now in her 10th year coaching high school girls' golf at St. Ignatius High School in Chicago. Her faith in Jesus Christ remains the focal point of her life. She thinks back to the time her OHS Golf Coach, Mr. Jim Jett, came to her home to tutor her in Geometry and has never forgotten the powerful and motivating influence teachers and coaches can have on their students.

Business

Ben Price Class of 1976





Ben is President, National Advertising Sales, for Discovery Communications. He oversees all advertising sales for Discovery's suite of 9 U.S. networks, including Discovery Channel, TLC, Animal Planet and Investigation Discovery. Although he currently lives in New York, Oceanside is where Ben calls "home," having moved here with his family when he was 9 years old from the small town of Lake City, South Carolina. Throughout his school years, Ben was very active in sports and extracurricular activities. He credits his parents, along with his teachers and coaches, with instilling in him the

strong values of teamwork, humility and perseverance. Ben went on to San Diego State University, graduating in 1980. He spent his summers coaching youth sports for the City of Oceanside Parks & Recreation. He earned his MBA from Pepperdine University in 1986 while working in risk management, marketing and sales roles with Xerox Corporation. He then took this foundation and moved to the media industry where he has spent the past 30 years in sales and marketing executive roles at Turner Broadcasting and Discovery Communications. Widely regarded as one of the media industry's most collaborative and innovative leaders, Ben has created partnerships with some of the most iconic brands including Discovery Channel, TLC, Animal Planet, NBA, Major League Baseball, and pop culture phenomena like Trading Spaces, Puppy Bowl, and the annual rite of summer, Shark Week. He has been honored with numerous media industry accolades and awards for leadership and mentoring, most recently having been named to CableFAX Magazine's list of the top 100 cable industry heavy hitters. Ben's industry involvement includes board positions for the International Radio & Television Society, Ad Council, and the Video Advertising Bureau. He is a member of the Academy of Television Arts & Sciences and an active volunteer for the City of Hope Cancer Center, American Heart Association, and Boys & Girls Club of America. Oceanside holds a very special place in Ben's heart, as he and his wife Anthy have two grown daughters, Thea and Marika, who both reside in Los Angeles.



John Toennessen

Class of 1951





John moved to Oceanside in 1945 and graduated from Oceanside-Carlsbad High School in 1951. While in high school, he served on ASB council and was Student Body Treasurer. John was also voted as "Most Service to OCHS" his Senior Year. He attended Oceanside-Carlsbad Junior College serving all 4 semesters on their Student Council and was Sophomore Class President. John worked for the banking industry for 26 years, acting locally as Manager, District Administrator and Bank Examiner, with one interruption when serving the United States in the Korean War primarily in Tokyo, Japan. Once home, he

became a member of the Oceanside Junior Chamber (now called Jaycees) where he held all their offices through President, receiving awards for his leadership throughout the State of California. Some of his other Oceanside community projects were Chairman of Harbor Days and the Days of San Luis Rey Fiesta. He played Santa Claus in the local Santa Claus Village a number of times and worked on the "Miss Southern California" pageants with the Oceanside Chamber of Commerce. He later chaired the Oceanside Japanese Odori Festival and the United States Marine Corps Oceanside Night Beach Invasion program. On numerous occasions he was the Finance Chair for the San Luis Rey Mission Festivals. He was later awarded "Senatorship" in the Junior Chamber of Commerce and lifetime membership in both the Junior and Senior Chamber of Commerce. The Oceanside business community honored him as the "Outstanding Young Man of the Year" later receiving the keys to the City of Oceanside from two of our city mayors. He was nominated 4 times for "Who's Who in America." John retired from banking at age 45 but continued his full-time community service efforts until his death in December 2016. He served in five different food distribution programs, served as a docent at Heritage Park and taught dancing at local senior centers in North County. In March 2007 John was awarded a "Community Service Volunteer Award" by the Kiwanis International Oceanside Pacific Club. He continued to serve the local senior centers in numerous capacities until his death.

Public Service

Joseph Sepulveda

Class of 1976





Joe was born and raised in Oceanside and graduated from OHS in 1976, having the honor of being on the 1975 CIF Championship football team. After high school he attended MiraCosta, Palomar, San Diego State University and ultimately graduated from Cal State San Marcos in 1994 with a BA in History and minor in Criminal Justice. He was hired by the Oceanside Police Department and attended the San Diego Regional Police Academy, then assigned to numerous law enforcement duties including Patrol Officer, Field Training Officer, Senior Police Officer, Beach Team Officer and several drug and fugitive task forces. He was later assigned to the Special Enforcement Bureau as a Gang and Narcotics Detective. In

1989, he was selected as one of the first School Resource Officers (SRO) assigned to work directly on the campus at El Camino High School. With his tireless work at the schools, the NAACP recognized him for his Community Service. For a time, Joe was the only SRO and had to cover all of the schools, once more SROs were added to the police force in 1994, Joe was assigned to his alma mater, OHS, where he remained until his retirement in 2012. Joe was known as "Officer Joe" to all. While at OHS, Joe also taught classes as a Drug Abuse Resistance Education (D.A.R.E.) Instructor at Oceanside elementary schools, served on the Oceanside Unified School District's Student Attendance Review Board (SARB), helped write a Crisis Response Plan for the district, helped train all OUSD staff in crisis response, implementing lock down procedures and drills for the district, truancy sweeps, alcohol and tobacco sting operations and conducted home visits with parents. Joe initiated the Matthew Checchi Scholarship Fund, which awards scholarships to students interested in Criminal Justice careers. He also wrote and led police security plans for the current OUSD high school graduations and special events. After retirement, Joe continues to serve on the OUSD Suspension/Expulsion panel. Joe has been married for 31 years to Gloria, an Oceanside elementary school teacher. They have three adult children, Steven, Andrea and Anthony.




