Steve was born in 1950 at the Oceanside Hospital. He attended North Terrace Elementary, Jefferson Junior High, and Oceanside High School. He was an all-league and all-CIF basketball player. He was named Avocado League Player of the Year in 1968. He was also an all-conference college basketball player. During the summers, he taught swimming and lifeguarded for the City of Oceanside. Steve received a B.A. in economics and political science from Linfield College. His professional career took place primarily in Oregon. He began as an elementary teacher and high school basketball coach. He moved into educational

administration serving as a principal, deputy superintendent, and district superintendent. He continued his academic endeavors and received an M.S. and Ph.D. from the University of Oregon specializing in school law, labor relations, and school finance. Through his professional leadership and academic expertise, he helped districts improve their solvency, efficiency, and effectiveness in the pursuit of their educational missions. His professional decisions were always made in answer to the question, "What's best for kids?" Along his journey, Steve taught in a red one-room schoolhouse in Oregon's high desert where local cattle ranchers enlightened him regarding the difference between horse sense and horse manure. He became a storyteller, charming audiences with Uncle Remus's Brer Rabbit adventures. Costumed as a Wizard, he performed for schools, community groups, and community theater. He resides in the Central Oregon Cascades with his wife and two sons, where he bakes tasty snickerdoodle cookies.

The son of Mexican immigrants, Faustino (Tino) Ramos was born and raised in Southern California along with two younger brothers. He graduated Valedictorian from Oceanside High School in 1992. He attended Harvard where he elected a premed track, studied biochemistry and graduated in 1996. He received his medical degree from Cornell University Medical College in New York City in 2000. He went on to complete his general pediatrics residency, chief residency and a year of research in the hematology department at Children's Hospital of Orange County. Then he further specialized in cardiology by completing

his pediatric cardiology fellowship at the University of Texas Southwestern/Children's Medical Center Dallas in 2008. Board certified in pediatric cardiology, his clinical interests include general pediatric cardiology and fetal echocardiography screening for congenital heart disease. Speaking fluent Spanish, he treats patients from pre-birth to teenage. His passion is seeing families at his office. As a general pediatric cardiologist, he treats a variety of problems ranging from murmurs, chest pain and palpitations to syncope, hypertension, and hypercholesterolemia. Among these general symptoms, he will find those that have arrhythmias or structural heart defects which require intervention. Treating children with congenital heart defects is especially rewarding. Tino enjoys the relationships and trust developed with families as he manages the care of their children pre- and post-operatively in his office. He earned his M.D. from UCSD Medical School, completed Residency at Kaiser Los Angeles and works with Kaiser San Diego as a Family Medicine Physician. Becoming a doctor allowed him to combine his love of science and service. Dr.

Berdugo began his service to the community in 1991 as a 4th grader by becoming part of a Traditional Aztec Dance group, which he plans to continue for life. At OHS he tutored at-risk youth through the Gang Risk Intervention Program (GRIP), was 1st chair Trumpet and Drum Major in Marching Band, active in ASB and on the wrestling team. At Stanford, he mentored at-risk youth through the East Palo Alto Stanford Academy, played 1st Trumpet in Stanford's Mariachi Cardenal, and was active in MEChA and other student groups. Dr. Berdugo continues to serve his community by treating his patients, volunteering in Medical Missions to Tijuana and Jamaica, mentoring students, and giving lectures on Wellness through a whole-food, plant-based diet. For his own health, Dr. Berdugo became vegan in 2010. He loves spending time with his wife Hilda, his family and the Traditional Dance group, as well as playing music and participating in SpartanRace, marathons, triathlons, Ironman70.3 and other athletic events.

I attended OHS from 1965-1968. I have great memories: activities, academics, supportive teachers and lifelong friendships. Due to family commitments, I deferred college for 3 years and graduated summa cum laude from Long Beach State University with Bachelors and Masters Degrees in Criminal Justice (1976 and 1978). I worked as a peace officer for the State Department of Consumer Affairs for 7 years specializing in the investigation of hospital personnel diverting narcotics. While working full time, I attended Western State University School of Law with the help of a scholarship for members of law enforcement, and was on Law Review. After graduating in May 1985, I was hired in early 1986 as a Deputy District Attorney

with the Orange County District Attorney's Office where I remained until I retired. I loved trial work that earned me an assignment on the Sexual Assault Unit (SAU) where I prosecuted dozens of cases against rapists and child molesters; many resulting in life sentences. In 1999, I was promoted to Assistant District Attorney, overseeing DA operations in Newport Beach, and returning to the SAU in 2001 as the supervisor. I created innovative programs and served on committees dedicated to the protection of child victims. When I retired in 2014, I was the longest tenured and first female to supervise the SAU. I was blessed with a wonderful career, but I appreciate most my family and friends who stood by me during the ups and downs of life.







