Eric is the author and co-author of books and several journal articles about brain injury. He is a frequent speaker locally and nationally on Brain Injury and Recovery topics. Dr. Leaf served as an Assistant Professor of Psychology and Director of the master's program at the University of St. Mary. He works as a Disability Consultant for Social Security Disability, in private practice and as the Director of Counselling Services for his church, providing free counselling services as part of the church's outreach ministry. Roberta Millman-Ide


Class of 1976

Lee's senior year he hit a homerun over the trees, over the on ramp and onto the freeway contributing to his 500-batting average that year! As a result, he was selected to play on the county

all-star team that year. Lee went to Liberty University where he continued his baseball career for the next 4 years. He still holds 2 records at Liberty for pitching as well as 2nd team all American honors in 1981. Lee was drafted in the 4th round of the 1981 MLB by the Seattle Mariners. Lee went on to play in the big leagues for Seattle, New York Yankees, New York Mets, and St. Louis Cardinals. In 1982 he married Drew Robinson in Bakersfield, CA on the pitching mound with 2000 people in attendance. The local TV station reported that Drew has a new meaning to the phrase, "Diamonds are a girl's best friend," also, saying that "Tonight, Lee Guetterman issued the biggest walk of his career." Lee and Drew have four amazing children and three even more amazing grandchildren. After retiring from the game Lee and Drew moved to Lenoir City, TN. In 2001, they founded Crossroads Christian Academy, which they administrate to this day. Lee continues his love for the game instructing and coaching young and old from beginner to professional in the finer aspects of pitching and throwing, whether baseball or softball.

His career began in 1978 with Morey Boogie in Oceanside. After Morey was acquired, David staved with the parent company and

relocated to the Bay Area. During his 9 years with the company, he received his Juris Doctorate from Santa Clara University Law School in 1987. David joined a law firm in Oakland and was immediately assigned to the Oakland Alameda County Coliseum, negotiating with sports franchises and entertainment tenants. Since David specialized in business and real estate transactions, he was integral in the negotiations that relocated the Raiders from Los Angeles to Oakland. David moved back to Carlsbad and was a member of the Executive Team with Cobra Golf (Materials Director) and Tony Robbins (COO). Molly grew up in Oceanside. After graduating from OHS, she attended Central College in Iowa and went on to teach five grades in a two-room schoolhouse on Palomar Mountain. She met Eric Barron in Boulder, Colorado where they were married in 1982, eventually moving to Miami, Florida; State College, Pennsylvania; Austin, Texas; Boulder, Colorado; Tallahassee, Florida and back to State College before retiring in Pisgah Forest, North Carolina. While raising two children, she

began to volunteer in the school district - in the library and as classroom parent, and then as the PTO president. Molly's life changed as Eric became president of Florida State University and then Penn State University. As first lady, Molly championed many causes, particularly those that focused on student success. Over a period of twelve years, she warmly welcomed thousands of students, faculty, staff, and alumni into her home. Many say that Molly transformed the sense of community at both universities. 



