### **Eileen (Greer) Frazier**

*Class of 1988*



Eileen (Greer) Frazier was born in Maryland in 1971. Her father enlisted in the Marine Corps which eventually brought the family to Camp Pendleton. She started kindergarten at North Terrace Elementary and went on to attend Santa Margarita Elementary, Jefferson & Lincoln Middle Schools, and graduated from OHS as Salutatorian. After graduation, Eileen attended the University of California San Diego (Revelle College) where she earned her B.A. in Applied Mathematics and

her teaching credential. Eileen returned to OHS where she taught math for nine years. She was a program specialist at the district office for two years, and while there, she earned her Master's in Education Administration from CSU San Marcos. Her first administrative job was at OHS as Dean of Students. She also served as Assistance Principal at OHS for two years; principal of Jefferson Middle School for three years; principal of Cesar Chavez Middle School for four years; Director of Secondary Education for three years; Curriculum Coordinator at OHS for one year; and is the current principal at El Camino High School. In 2019, Eileen was featured in "The O'sider Magazine" as "Oceanside's Finest". In February of 2021, she was named as the Association of California School Administrators Secondary Principal of the Year. Eileen believes that servant leadership is the foundation of her work. She loves being able to "give back" to the community by educating students for the last 28 years. Eileen lives in Oceanside with her husband of 23 years, Greg, also an OHS graduate, and their two children.

### **Dr. Leif “Eric” Leaf**

Leif “Eric” Leaf was born in San Diego and raised in Oceanside. He completed his K-12 education in Oceanside, graduating from OHS in 1970. Eric attended MiraCosta College, San Diego State and received his bachelor’s and master’s degrees from Chico State University in Speech/Language Pathology and his PhD in Counselling Psychology from Indiana State University with an emphasis in Neuropsychology. Eric worked for the Oceanside Unified School District as a Speech

Pathologist. He has practiced Neuropsychology for more than 35 years supporting individuals with traumatic brain injury and their families, and leading TBI programs in Kansas City, Los Angeles, Chicago and Las Vegas. Eric is the author and co-author of books and several journal articles about brain injury. He is a frequent speaker locally and nationally on Brain Injury and Recovery topics. Dr. Leaf served as an Assistant Professor of Psychology and Director of the master’s program at the University of St. Mary. He works as a Disability Consultant for Social Security Disability, in private practice and as the Director of Counselling Services for his church, providing free counselling services as part of the church’s outreach ministry. Eric’s life’s mission has been encouraging and helping people. He loves spending time with his wife, Kim, sons Mason and Nick and their families including 4 awesome grandchildren. He enjoys surfing, writing, and travelling to support missions. He has travelled to Kenya, Haiti, Eastern Europe, and Central America to train missionary nurses as well as to build homes and spread the Gospel of Jesus Christ.

She/her work was juried into the Graphic & Advertising Design two-year Program, graduating in 1982 (a BFA in Advertising Design & Minor in Marketing). She spent the next decade working as an Art Director for two well-known Ad Agencies winning multiple awards. In 1992, she, her husband Chris & two young sons (Aaron & Brian), moved to New Jersey where Roberta started her own graphic/advertising design company “another bright IDEa, prod.”. In addition to designing, creating storyboards & new product boards for major clients, Roberta

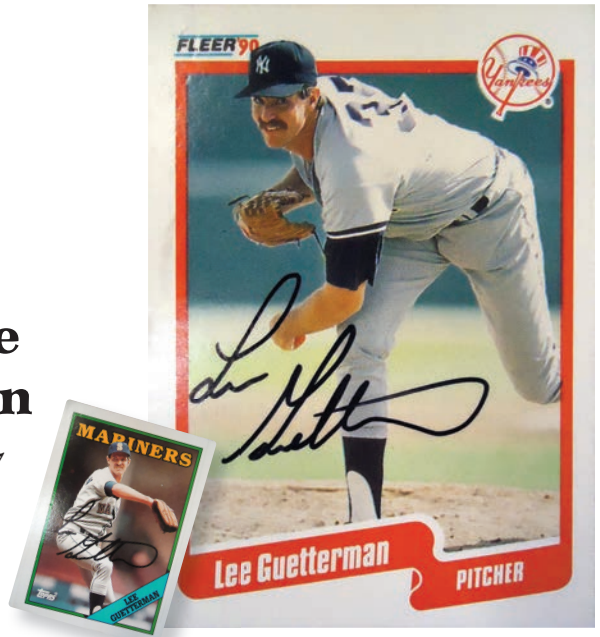

# Arthur Lee Guetterman

*Class of 1977*



Arthur Lee Guetterman was born in 1958 to Art and Ruth Guetterman, in Chattanooga Tennessee. Lee's dad was a chaplain in the Navy and was assigned to Camp Pendleton when Lee was 7 years old. His family remained in the area throughout Lee's high school career. He attended OHS, where he played baseball all 4 years. Lee's senior year he hit a homerun over the trees, over the on ramp and onto the freeway contributing to his 500-batting average that year! As a result, he was selected to play on the county all-star team that year. Lee went to Liberty University where he continued his baseball career for the next 4 years. He still holds 2 records at Liberty for pitching as well as 2nd team all American honors in 1981. Lee was drafted in the 4th round of the 1981 MLB by the Seattle Mariners. Lee went on to play in the big leagues for Seattle, New York Yankees, New York Mets, and St. Louis Cardinals. In 1982 he married Drew Robinson in Bakersfield, CA on the pitching mound with 2000 people in attendance. The local TV station reported that Drew has a new meaning to the phrase, "Diamonds are a girl's best friend," also, saying that "Tonight, Lee Guetterman issued the biggest walk of his career." Lee and Drew have four amazing children and three even more amazing grandchildren. After retiring from the game Lee and Drew moved to Lenoir City, TN. In 2001, they founded Crossroads Christian Academy, which they administrate to this day. Lee continues his love for the game instructing and coaching young and old from beginner to professional in the finer aspects of pitching and throwing, whether baseball or softball.

# David M. Meyer

*Class of 1974*



David was born and raised in Oceanside, attending St. Mary's Elementary School before OHS. David won league championships with the Pirates in football and baseball, reaching the CIF baseball championship in 1974. He attended MiraCosta College, won a state baseball championship, and was drafted by the SF Giants in 1976. David received his B.A. in Economics/Accounting from Claremont McKenna College. His career began in 1978 with Morey Boogie in Oceanside. After Morey was acquired, David stayed with the parent company and relocated to the Bay Area. During his 9 years with the company, he received his Juris Doctorate from Santa Clara University Law School in 1987. David joined a law firm in Oakland and was immediately assigned to the Oakland Alameda County Coliseum, negotiating with sports franchises and entertainment tenants. Since David specialized in business and real estate transactions, he was integral in the negotiations that relocated the Raiders from Los Angeles to Oakland. David moved back to Carlsbad and was a member of the Executive Team with Cobra Golf (Materials Director) and Tony Robbins (COO). He spent 10 years in sports licensing, first as General Counsel with Upper Deck Company, responsible for licensing transactions with professional sports leagues and athletes, and in 2000 opened his own law firm. He is V.P., Chief Legal Officer of Aurora Spine, a medical device company in Carlsbad, spearheading the company's IPO on the Toronto Venture Stock Exchange in 2013. David's father, Herb, was inducted in the first class of the OHS Hall of Fame. David lives in Carlsbad with his partner Cetta and enjoys time with her two children and their three grandsons.



## Community Service

### **Molly (Hatter) Barron**

*Class of 1969*



Molly grew up in Oceanside. After graduating from OHS, she attended Central College in Iowa and went on to teach five grades in a two-room schoolhouse on Palomar Mountain. She met Eric Barron in Boulder, Colorado where they were married in 1982, eventually moving to Miami, Florida; State College, Pennsylvania; Austin, Texas; Boulder, Colorado; Tallahassee, Florida and back to State College before retiring in Pisgah Forest, North Carolina. While raising two children, she

began to volunteer in the school district – in the library and as classroom parent, and then as the PTO president. Molly's life changed as Eric became president of Florida State University and then Penn State University. As first lady, Molly championed many causes, particularly those that focused on student success. Over a period of twelve years, she warmly welcomed thousands of students, faculty, staff, and alumni into her home. Many say that Molly transformed the sense of community at both universities. Molly played a leadership role in developing programs focused on women in philanthropy. Her own philanthropy reflected her personal priorities. Molly and Eric created endowments for the library, Marching Chiefs, celebration of successful young alumni, the Asolo Theater, and for Women for FSU. At Penn State, they created endowments for student food security, global programs, multiple need-based scholarships, the Palmer Art Museum, the Student Veterans Center, and funding for student emergencies and for the arboretum. In addition, Molly served on advisory boards for both the Penn State libraries and the State College libraries.

Kerry moved to Oceanside as a high school freshman in 1971 when her father became the Assistant Superintendent in the Oceanside Unified School District. She was active in choir, tennis, and enjoyed time with friends. As a senior, Kerry was awarded the Bank of America Achievement Award in Social Studies for “Distinguished Performance and the Promise of Future Success and Service to Society.” Kerry attended UC San Diego where she received a Bachelor of Arts, majoring in psychology with an emphasis in child development. She then graduated from Cal State Hayward’s School Psychology Master’s program in 1981. Retired as of May 2022, Kerry’s career as a school psychologist spanned 41 years, 35 of which she spent in Castro Valley, California. Kerry has helped over 2,000 children and their families understand their special needs and thrive in their own unique ways. Throughout her career, Kerry was a calming, safe space and passionate advocate for her students, creating pathways for access to the same quality of services as she would want for her own family. During this time, she also raised four children and beat late-stage ovarian cancer. Kerry is honored to have served the public as a school psychologist for four decades and leaves her practice confident that she did her best to serve society as challenged by the OHS Bank of America award. In retirement, Kerry looks forward to spending more time with her husband, Yomi, and their children, grandson, and friends.
