Casey Advances \$17.5 Million for Southwestern Pennsylvania Projects in FY23 Spending Bills

Federal funding will be used to support economic development, infrastructure and education

Washington, D.C. - Today, U.S. Senator Bob Casey (D-PA) is announcing the inclusion of community project funding for 17 projects around Southwestern Pennsylvania in the Senate Fiscal Year (FY) 2023 Appropriations bills. Senator Casey advocated for each of the projects to be included in the appropriations subcommittee bills. FY2022 marked the first time in a decade that Congress sent federal dollars directly to community projects across the Nation.

"I am proud to advance funding for projects that will support communities across Southwestern Pennsylvania. From supporting economic development in the Hill District in Pittsburgh to providing life skills classes to people with disabilities in Fayette, Greene and Washington Counties, these projects will better the lives of people across the region," said Senator Casey. "As the Senate advances these spending bills, I will fight to ensure the federal government invests in our Commonwealth."

The U.S. Senate Appropriations Committee released the 12 subcommittee bills today. The bills will have to be passed in the Senate and then will enter a period of review with appropriations bills from the House of Representatives. Once both the Senate and House agree to legislative text, they will be sent to the President for his signature and enactment into law.

Hill Community Development Corporation	\$2,000,000	This project will provide funding for the New Granada Square redevelopment project in Pittsburgh's historic Hill District. The completion of this project will enable job creation and small business development that will unlock the economic potential of the Hill District, directly benefitting its residents.	Allegheny
House of Manna Public Health Hub	\$2,000,000	House of Manna, a human services institution originally built by community activists and faith leaders that has since fallen into disrepair. This project will bring the building into good condition to accommodate human service providers, community educators and healthy food options for local residents. Mansmann Foundation	\$1,170,000	This project will provide funding for the Entrepreneurs Forever program to fund the expansion of their peer- to-peer entrepreneurship program, intended for small businesses making under \$1 million, to 300 local small businesses in 25 counties in western Pennsylvania. The Mansmann Foundation is based in Pittsburgh.	

U.S. Army Corps of Engineers	\$2,000,000	This project will support a critical sewer overflow component of Allegheny County Sanitary Authority's (ALCOSAN) \$2 billion Clean Water Plan. The project will demolish some structures and construct others in order to seriously reduce the overflows of diluted, untreated wastewater into the region's waterways.	Allegheny
Big Brothers Big Sisters of Greater Pittsburgh	\$105,000	This project supports the recruitment, training and matching of LGBTQ+ adult volunteer mentors with LGBTQ+ youth through Big Brothers Big Sisters of Greater Pittsburgh's Big Siblings Program.	Allegheny
Freeport Borough	\$1,500,000	This project will upgrade Freeport Borough's wastewater treatment facility to minimize sewage contamination into Buffalo Creek, a popular recreational boating area that flows into the Allegheny River.	Armstrong
Municipal Water Authority of Aliquippa	\$500,000	This project will replace critical water infrastructure including waterlines and valves in order to mitigate water loss, reduce the cost burden on residents and improve service to southwestern Pennsylvania.	Beaver

The equipment & technology will be used to support classrooms, laboratories and simulation labs that provide high-quality, affordable nursing education in order to help address critical nursing shortages and provide students with access to in-demand, well-paying jobs in Western Pennsylvania. Albert Gallatin Municipal Authority	\$500,000	This funding is for Gans, Springhill Township, PA and will expand the distribution system to give more residents in southwestern Pennsylvania access to clean drinking water and repair control valves to maintain the water system.	Fayette
Lower Ten Mile Joint Sewer Authority	\$500,000	This funding is for Jefferson, PA and will replace an outdated sewer system in order to provide reliable sewer service to residents not previously served in the region. It will also help eliminate environmental and human health risks posed by faulty sewer systems.	Greene
Central Allegheny Challenger Learning Center	\$1,495,000	The project will help establish a Challenger Learning Center Simulator, complete with a Mission Control, Spacecraft, Transport room, and Briefing room, to provide a hands-on, immersive space learning experience to K-12 students at the Central Allegheny Challenger Learning Center in Indiana. This program would broaden access to STEM education in western Pennsylvania and provide targeted programming for underrepresented groups in STEM, including students of color, low-income students, girls, and students in rural communities.
